It is usually 36 to 40 inches high and has a four-inch space for the call's head.

SANITARY SHED FOR MILKING

Cows Should Be Kept Clean and Ud-ders Wiped With Damp Cloth to Keep Out Dirt.

The cows should be kept clean and milked in a place free from dust. If the udders of the cows are wiped with a damp cloth it will prevent dirt, dan-druf, and hair from failing into the milk with their millions of bacteria. A covered or small-top milk pall should always be used in milking, ig keeps out more than half of the germs.
