

Detroit Policeman Shot To Death In Inner City

DETROIT -- An Illinois parolee has shot and killed a veteran Detroit police officer in a gun battle at the Jefferson Housing project.

Parolee Henry Matthews, 31, suffered three wounds during a shoot-out after he had fatally shot Sgt. Edward Wolinski. Two other policemen, Richard Paduch and Richard Woytner, suffered minor injuries.

The fatal shooting of Sgt. Wolinski occurred after he and fellow officers responded to a radio call that a man was shooting a woman.

TRAVERSE CITY -- Preston N. Tanis, director of North-

western Michigan College since it opened in 1951, has been named the college's first president by the board of trustees.

Tanis is a native of Holland and a graduate of Hope College and the University of Michigan.

GRAND RAPIDS -- Mrs. Barbara Lee McManus, 37-year-old mother of three, has been charged for embezzling funds from the Sunshine Hospital through fake insurance claims.

Circuit Judge Claud Vanderploeg handed down the decision which ordered Mrs. McManus to pay a fine and make restitution for a total of \$4,907.

Mrs. McManus claimed she never benefited from the "padding claims" while an employee of the hospital. She contended the extra money was turned over to the patients.

ANN ARBOR -- Professor Emeritus Philip E. Bursley, 87, a member of the University of Michigan faculty for 42 years, has died following a long illness.

Prof. Bursley, a member of the University's Romance language department, was the father of State Sen. Gilbert E. Bursley.

ANN ARBOR -- The Ann Arbor City Council has liberalized its liquor-sale ordinance by permitting the sale of liquor by the glass on Sundays after 2 p.m.

Establishments with food and service sales totaling at least 50 per cent of gross revenues will be eligible to apply for the special license to sell liquor on Sundays.

Don't Let Goats Get Your Goat

Dairy goats are coming to the Michigan State Fair as participants in official competition for the first time in the 119-year history of the Fair.

The dairy goat show at the State Fair is limited to competition for junior exhibitors. Four breeds are included: Alpine, Nubian, Saanen and Toggenburg.

AS FOR FOOD, a goat will chew the label from a tin can to get the glucose. He'll pass over grass and clover to eat weeds and tree leaves which contain the vital minerals his diet requires. He'll chew on a wool jacket, untie your shoe laces or pull the handkerchief from your pocket.

The best milkers yield 4,000 to 5,000 lbs. within a year as compared to a cow which produces about 14,000 lbs. Herdsmen say that goat milk has a lower sugar content, the ash content is higher, fat globules smaller, has a finer curd and is considered one of the most healthful of foods.

The Alpine, a good milk producer, hails from France. The Toggenburg was introduced to this country in 1893 from Switzerland. He's a sort brown with a white tail and white stripe running from eye to muzzle on each side of the face.

The Saanen is usually pure white, short haired and bearded. This breed also comes from Switzerland and is considered the Holstein of goats. The long, droopy-eared Nubian hails from Africa and is a cross-breed of native Egyptian, Indian and Toggenburg stock.

A NUMBER OF GOATS, owned by junior showmen, were invited to the State Fair last year for exhibition purposes. This year cash awards are being offered.

E.J. "Jeff" Keirns, State Fair general manager, says he understands the demand for goat milk exceeds the supply and that goat herding apparently is heading for a larger role in Michigan agriculture.

LANSING -- Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley has ruled that both candidates for Congress and committees formed to aid them must file separate detailed accounts and statements for both primary and general elections.

In answer to a series of queries from Sec. of State James Hare, Kelley also ruled that:

1. Campaign committees formed to raise money for candidates must file a detailed account and statement as required by law.

2. A committee formed for political education purposes which does not actively participate in an election campaign, is not required to file a campaign account.

A committee formed to oppose propositions submitted in local elections is a political committee with the meaning of the Corrupt Practices Act, and corporations are prohibited from making contributions to such committees.

LANSING -- Construction of Michigan's proposed new \$40

million Capitol may begin as early as next year.

This stepped-up time schedule was revealed after the State Administration Board approved a \$246,800 purchase of 10 parcels of property located in a four-square block area that will be the sight of the new Capitol.

In addition to the actual purchase, the board also set aside \$3 million for land acquisitions to round out an eventual 70-acre site for a downtown state office complex.

JACKSON -- Reports that 20 to 40 shots were fired at a Jackson police car last Monday may have been an exaggeration, according to Jackson

Police Chief Earl B. Miller.

Miller said he could not understand why none of the shots struck the patrol car. He said as far as he has been able to determine, none of the shots hit anything.

In the event of any similar incidents in the future, Miller said, his men have been ordered to return fire.

LANSING -- While accelerating the State Capitol development, the State Administrative Board has also pushed along several other projects.

High on the list is the Michigan State University Administration Building, allocated \$1.55 million more, by the board's members.

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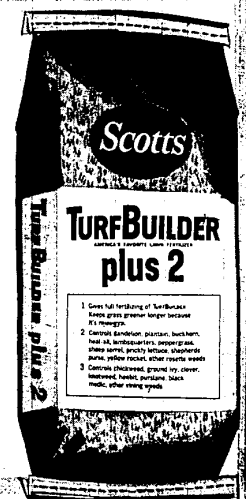
