

Peppers and Celery in Brine.
Green peppers and celery can be preserved for future use by brining. If properly dope peppers so prepared can be used for future use by brining. If properly dope peppers so prepared can be used as substitute for fresh peppers in pickles or salads, or after freshenting in water can be used for stuffed pepper. Itemove the stems and seed and pack nose down into a water-light, non-metallic receptacle, such as a legibarrel, crock or glass fruit jar.
