LAST MONDAY night's meeting, though, in keeping with other summer meetings, was practically void of an audience.

The board handled almost all fiscal items, even though the bi-monthly invoices had been delayed from the previous Thursday to Monday because of a computer breakdown.

Mr. Vagozzi suggested that only the payroll be approved, allowing the board more time to study the remaining invoices. But Vagozzi's motion failed, and all invoices were okayed.

The board also agreed to a hike of \$201.24 in leasing two new portable classrooms for Shiawassee School.

The two classrooms will now cost \$3,393.24 total per year for five years plus \$1,600 in initial relocation costs. The district will own the mobiles after five years.

The board had previously passed on leasing these two and buying two new portable classrooms to go along with six portables already owned by the district.

Monday night's action officially brings the count to 10 portables—for a total value of almost \$100,000.

THE AGENDA for the same meeting will be a public discussion on school dress regulations and student conduct. The board does not have an overall conduct code but may adopt one later this fall.

Peters has promised to set up a 15-minute reservation on future school board agenda for audience opinions and questions.

REPORT SURVEY CHESLEY DRIVE PARKING LOT BIG BOY RESTAURANT.

At the last Council Meeting the City Manager was requested to ascertain the feelings of the property owner, abutting the proposed parking lot on the north side of Chesley Drive.

Chief Manager Dixon reported of the eleven questionnaires sent out he had received about four back but they were all in the negative.

In addition to this the City had received twelve telephone calls from owners of the immediate neighborhood objecting to this proposal.

Motion by Yoder supported by Selbert to the request to utilize the property north of Chesley Drive for the Big Boy Restaurant be denied. Motion carried, all ayes.

REPORT BIDS ON WOODCROFT STORM SEWER.

The City of Farmington received fifteen storm sewer bids for the Woodcroft Subdivision as per advertisement on 2 p.m. Thursday, July 17th, 1969. The low bidder was Mid-West Contracting Company and the City Manager stated they had been checked out by the City Engineer and found to be financially stable, and with good work experience in the sewer construction line. He stated that other municipalities had recommended Mid-West for work they had done previously.

Unfortunatly when they submitted their bid, their 55' bid bond was inadvertently left out of the envelope, although they were able to get it prior to the completion of the bidding. The second low bidder protested this irregularity of bidding procedure, but actually this protest was unfounded because the bid bond of 1% was made out to the City of Farmington and was submitted prior to the completion of the bidding, and the bid bond is required to insure the City in case of default in proceeding with the contract. On checking with the City Attorney he agreed that the irregularity was inconsequential and did not affect the bidding procedure. Therefore the City Manager recommended the bid be awarded to Mid-West Contracting Company.

Motion by Yoder supported by Richardson to adopt the following resolution: BE IT RESOLVED:

That the City of Farmington award the contract for the storm sewer construction Subdivision to Mid-West Contracting Co. in the amount of \$42,831.00.

REPORT BIDS ON WOODCROFT ASPHALT PAVING.

City Manager Dixon reported the City had received three bids for the construction of 7" deep-strength asphalt paving for Woodcroft Subdivision at 2:30 p.m. Thursday, July 17th, 1969, and that A. & A. Asphalt Company was low bidder at \$92,460.00.

In analyzing the low bid of A. & A. Asphalt Company, City Manager Dixon found sections that could be deleted and also used of the bid to reduce the total cost of this project. He stated he had been able to reduce the excavation from \$17,500 to \$10,000 before under excavation \$2,500 and substitution \$4,500 and also delete miscellaneous asphalt \$1,400. These deletions amounting to \$11,900 were acceptable to the A. & A. Asphalt Company and he therefore recommended the City award the bid in the amount of \$80,560.00.

The Farmington Center Corporation has sold out its interest to the Farmington Center Corporation, which is made up of the same group of men with a lower number of owners. Yoder asked about the City Manager if he had checked the smoke output from Mills Products. City Manager Dixon told him the Building Inspector had been down there and on checking the materials they were heavy, stated that some papers had been put in or far like substance on it as was causing the black smoke and odor. Mills Products have been made aware of it, and they will try to avoid this incident in the future.

Mr. H. Miller of 1301 Meadowlark Road registered an objection to the smoke and said he had spoken to the City Manager about this and was asked what the residents could do to help and was told to call the Department of Public Safety. In the same smoke condition he had been told to call the City Manager.

REPORT FROM CITY MANAGER.

City Manager Dixon reported the City had allocated \$10,000 from the Treasurer's Office and \$100,000 from the Mayor's Office to be used in the purchase of a new machine and the necessary forms and materials to program this machine to the City's operation.

It was felt that the cost of a new machine would be somewhere in the neighborhood of \$10,000 which could be financed over a three year period. Plans and Specs. for the City of Farmington have recommended the purchase of a rebuilt backhoe machine, and it is the opinion that this used machine would work equally as well as a new machine. It was recommended that the City purchase one National Cash Register Model No. 31-21, 21 totals, and amounting to \$5,000.00.

City Manager Dixon reported that based on the large reduction in the cost of this used equipment, he felt the City would be in a position to pay for it outright and not have to finance over a three year period as was previously contemplated. He requested the City Council to waive the formality of sealed bids as it would
