Travelers Aid, a Torch Drive service, is offering special group sessions this summer for parents whose children will be traveling alone, whether by plane or by bus.

Children who take part in the sessions learn what will happen on their trip and whom they can ask for help if they have a problem. They learn how to make a collect telephone call home if necessary, what to do if they feel sick on the bus and what

kind of a lunch to take with them in case they get hungry.

We receive a lot of calls this time of year for advice about children traveling alone, particularly the children of divorced parents," said Mary Willis, a Travelers Aid caseworker supervisor.

"Our Protective Travel Service is the answer for children who are going to spend a few weeks out-of-town with their mother or father," Miss Willis continued.

"Our caseworkers are equipped to help with just about any problem in the area of mobility counseling."
