cludes ophthalmologists and optometrists before doing therapy casework. And they have to show 15 successful cases before the orthokeratology board to open a clinic.
About three-fourths of my practice is orthokeratology therapy cases and one-fourth is referral from doctors for contact lens patients who require special fitting, such as bifocals," Dr. Potts explained.
He added that proper eye care for young children before myopia develops could prevent or minimize the extent of myopia.
Children who read a lot and do not look away from the book to relax the near-point focusing muscles at least once for every page read can decrease their eyes," he said.

GOOD POSTURE and adequate light are also important factors in eye health. Dr. Potts does not approve of study carrels used in some schools because the degree of confinement prevents relaxing near-point focus.
They should at least put a mirror on the facing wall so the youngster can look at a distance occasionally. My office is paneled with mirrors for this very purpose," he said.
