

Belafonte at Pine Knob

Harry Belafonte will be the headliner at 8 p.m. Thursday through Sunday at Pine Knob Music Theatre in Clarkston.

Belafonte has been called "the man who brought folk singing into its own with other musical forms such as jazz, opera and the classics." His songs are the songs of people all over the globe, of all fields of endeavor and every area of expression.

Born in New York City, Belafonte moved with his family to Jamaica, B.W.I. while a young boy, lived there for five years, then returned to New York. In 1944, he joined the U.S. Navy for a two-year tour of duty.

After the Navy, he became a member of the American Negro Theatre with his very close friend, Sidney Poitier, and eventually joined the workshop. In one of the Drama Workshop productions, Belafonte's role called for him to sing one number. The singing of that song proved to be important in retrospect some time later.

For one night, he was asked to sing at the Royal Roost, a New York night club, and he was signed to an original two-week contract which ran for 20 weeks. He became a fairly successful pop singer, but he was unhappy with this type of work and quit cold, determined to either find his proper niche in show business or get out.

Late in 1950, after much soul searching he returned to show business (with two guitarists Millard Thomas and Craig Work) and began to build a repertoire of old and modern folk ballads. He was booked into the Village Vanguard night club, where he received raves, and his show business comeback had begun.

This modest beginning led to a contract with RCA records and motion pictures. In 1955, he became a full-fledged star on Broadway in the Paul Gregory production "Three for Three." His RCA albums are still among the leading sellers in the world.

His art, as well as his social awareness, have come to be known all over the world. He has been honored many times by such diversified groups as the American Jewish Congress, the NAACP, the Committee for United Negro Relief, The City of Hope, Fight for Sight and Bonds for Israel.

Due to his close association with the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Belafonte was named one of the three executors of his estate, and to the Board of Directors of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

He has four children and he and his wife Julie live in New York City.
