AMERICAN T-BALL
American T-Ball defeated National T-Ball in the All-Star game for the first time. 23-17 The American team jumped off with nine runs in the first inning and then fought off the Nationals, almost letting a slip away in the bottom of the ninth, when, with two outs, the National team scored five runs. The game was highlighted by fine fielding plays by both teams, cutting down runners with accurate throws and excellent tags. The main difference seemed to be the base running of the American League, as runners attempted to take extra bases at every opportunity.

NATIONAL MINORS

The Giants are the kings of the National Minors with a convincing 11-1 win over the Reds, who were the winners of the first half of the season. Putting across five runs in the first inning, the Giants never trailed; they combined good pitching by John Rock, Pat Rizzo and Tom Seaver, with the bats. In the midst of the country celebrating its 300th year, the Detroit Lions begin training for season number 69 on Monday, July 12. During the first week, Coach Rick Forzano will greet a total of 20 players or the Oakland University campus in Rochester.

The 1976 Lions will have only 12 days to prepare for their first pre-season game, July 24 in Canton, Ohio, against Denver. The first of 10 home games at Pontiac Stadium is a week later against the Buffalo Bills.

"We will have the most competitive camp we've had since, I've been here," stated Frosano, who is starting his third year as head coach. Forty-nine of the total roster are returning veterans. There are 11 draft choices and 15 free agents.

Following the format instituted last year, there will be only one workout each day, at 2:30 p.m. Fortanzo will oversee the practices, aided by a staff of nine assistant coaches, three of whom are new this year: Bob Gibson, offensive backfield; Ken Shipp, offensive coordinator, receivers and quarterbacks; and Art Zelenik, special teams and receivers.

This year's training camp will be only four weeks long, until Aug. 6, after which time the players will continue to practice at Oakland though no longer living there. During camp, the Lions dormitory, and of

Office will be Hill House. Starting Aug. 9, the team's regular office facilities at nearby Pontiac Stadium will be used to conduct pre-season business.

Fortness urges the public to come out and watch the 1976 Lions in training. Practices are open to spectators with free parking available on the college grounds. With the one-a-day practice schedule the sessions are long, most lasting three hours.

Last season, the Lions finished second to Minnesota, the seventh straight second-place standing in the Central Division of the National Conference. Last year's team was 7-7 while the Vikings were 12-3. Green Bay and Chicago were both 6-10.

The 73 Lions were plagued by a season-long rash of injuries which finally took their toll. At the end of the schedule, 15 players were on the team's extensive injury list, including such regulars as Bill Munson, Greg Landry, Larry Walton and Steve Owens.

Three new Lions, first draft choice James Hunter, second pick David Hill and third round choice John Woodcock, will miss the start of camp because of their participation in the College All-Star game July 13 against the Steelers in Chicago. For the rest of the 1976 squad, press and picture day will be Wednesday, July 14 at 1 p.m.
