Actually many good scores are simply the result of an opponent's error. The obvious key to success is to watch for these errors and take advantage of the situation.

The jack forced the king. Myrtle quickly drew trumps and finessed the eight of diamonds. The ace smothered the queen and produced 11 tricks in the red suits. The club ace made a total of 12.

JCC president congratulates Ford

John H. Shephard of Southfield president of the Jewish Community Council of Metropolitan Detroit, has released the text of a letter sent to President Gerald R. Ford expressing the council's "sincere admiration" for his July 4 message of congratulations to Israel Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin upon the successful rescue by Israeli commandos of more than 100 airline passengers who had been held hostage in Uganda by terrorists.

Shephard's letter said: "Implicit in your message is an understanding that Israel acted correctly under the circumstances and in this we heartily concur."

"It is obvious from the incident that terrorists neither recognize nor respect international laws relating to territorial boundaries. It is equally obvious that remedies for such problems can have no effect so long as they are framed in accordance with strict decrees of territorial boundaries."

"We believe that the latest blacking incident constitutes an appropriate occasion for our action to renege its efforts to deal effectively, on an international level, with such outrageous endangerment of human life."

"We call upon our government to assume and assert its leadership role among the nations of the world in framing concrete proposals and actions to deal with such acts of international terrorism."
