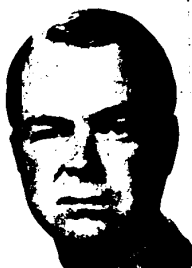
## Visit yesterday at First Church

## Re-election bid made by John McDonald

John J. McDonald, Oakland County Commissioner, will seek re-election to represent District 27, which includes the City of Farmington and portions of Farmington Hills and Southfield, on the county board.

McDonald, 36, is the Republican caucus chairman of the board of commissioners, as well as vice chairman of the general government committee and a member of the human resources committee.

"I am confident that, through my continuing communication with citizens in my district, my constituents are among the most well-informed in the country," he said.

"I want to continue that dialogue, including my monthly news letters, for the next two years."

A resident of the Farmington area since 1965, McDonald has been active in civic, government and community programs as a member of the chamber of commerce, Optimist Club and the Farmington Area Advisory Council.

In announcing his re-election priorities, McDonald emphasized his desire to continue various programs established during his first term as county commissioner.

## Ford taps Hills men for negotiating duty

Three Farmington Hills auto executives will lead a 16-member Ford Motor Co. negotiating team in collective bargaining with the United Auto Workers union.

J. Robert Anderson, Arthur Hanlon and Robert Plummer will represent Ford in labor talks beginning this week at the company's World Headquarters in Dearborn. Joining the three local labor relations and finance experts is Sidney McKenna, Ford's vice president for labor relations. He has been a principal on every Ford negotiating team since 1961.

Plummer is a manager of union relations on the labor relations staff at Ford.

Since joining the company in 1953 as a manufacturing clerk in a New Jersey plant, Plummer has held several supervisory and managerial positions.

He left the New Jersey plant to work in the labor relations section of another plant in 1960, later serving as a supervisor of salaried personnel and training, and head of labor relations at that plant.

PLUMMER CAME to the Detroit area as a labor relations representative in 1968. In 1972, he was appointed manager of the industrial relations department at the Atlanta Assembly Plant.

He returned to Detroit in 1974 as a union relations manager and manager of the hourly personnel and labor relations at the Metal Stamping Division in 1975.

He was appointed to his present position in October 1975. Plummer received a bachelor of arts degree from Manhattan College in New York.

Hanlon is manager of the employment practices and programs department on the labor relations staff.

He originally joined forces with Ford's steel division in 1952, where he worked before joining the law firm of Hanlon and Hanlon.

He returned to Ford in 1964 as a labor relations representative at the Wayne Assembly Plant.

From 1966 until 1972, he was an arbitration representative on the labor relations staff. Later he became manager of that department for Ford's General Services Division. He was named to his present position in October.

A native of River Rouge, Hanlon holds a bachelor of arts and a law degree from the University of Michigan.

Joining the other two local arbitrators will be Anderson, the assistant treasurer of the finance staff.

ANDERSON CAME to Ford in 1963 as a financial analyst and in 1965 became assistant plant controller at the company's Sterling Plant.

After serving in two supervisory positions on the finance staff, he was appointed manager of the profit forecast department in 1967 and manager of the facilities and property department in 1969.

In 1972 he was appointed assistant controller for the company.

trouler for the company and the next year was named director of diversified products analysis.

He became assistant treasurer in June 1974. Born in Boston, Anderson attended the University of South Carolina where he received a bachelor of arts degree. He received his master's degree from the Stanford University Graduate School of Business.

Formal negotiations began Tuesday, marking the seventh time that contract talks with the UAW have taken place at the company's world headquarters. About 167,000 Ford employees in the United States are covered by the present three-year Ford UAW agreement that expires at 11:58 p.m. Sept. 14.

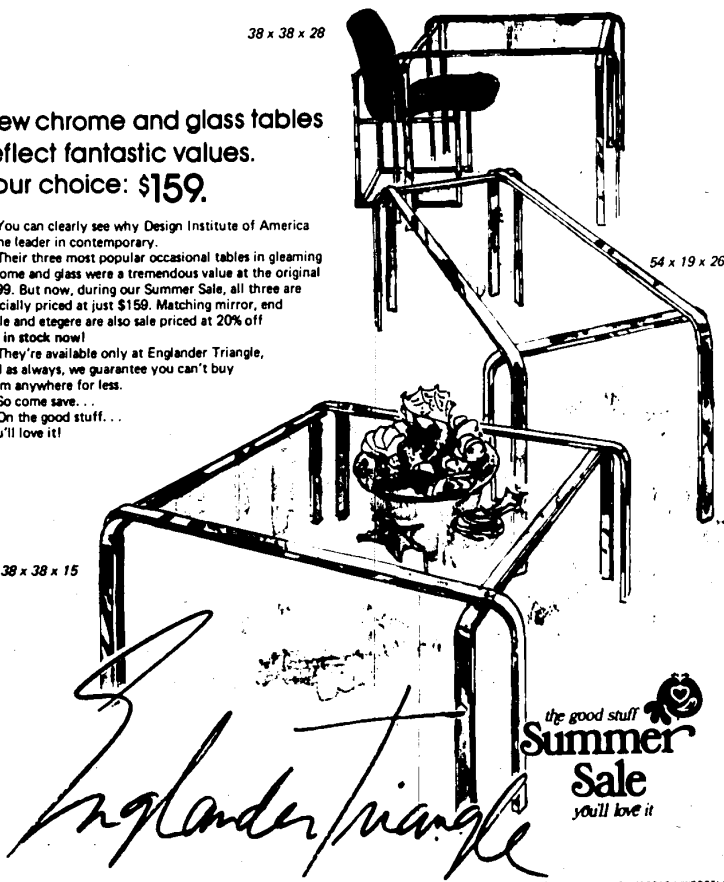
