

Pine Knob sets stars

The rock and roll group Pine Knob will headline the show Saturday at Pine Knob Music Theater, while vocalist Judy Collins will star Sunday.

The Double Brothers, who opened Wednesday, continue Thursday of this week. All the scheduled concerts are at 7:30 p.m. at the Coach in Clinton.

Pine Knob is comprised of 10 men from Boise and Kansas City, Boston and New

York. Their backgrounds combine acting, singing, dancing and performing.

Judy Collins' beginning in music was the study of classical piano with Antonio Bros. teacher and conductor. But, as she grew up, she started to learn folk music from her friends.

Now she sings material from a wider range of her contemporaries and has expanded her repertoire to include music by

Brecht/Weill and Jacques Brel.

With the release of "Wildflowers," July added a new dimension to her life-long writing. Since that time, every new Collins album has contained at least one of her own songs.

The Double Brothers is a conglomerate of seven performers from all over the United States. They have done extensive tours of the U.S. and Europe.

Music stars shine for concert

Planet Van Cliburn, soprano Shirley Verrett and violinist Pinchas Zukerman are three musical stars who will distinguish the 1976-77 Founders Society Detroit Institute of Arts Concert Series.

Announcing the 21st season of concert, Edith J. Freeman, the museum's honorary curator of music, commented: "Rarely is there an opportunity to enjoy so many truly fine artists in one season."

Performances will include:

- Sept. 14—The 16-member Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by 35-year-

old Michael Tilson Thomas, judged by Aaron Copland as "another Bernstein."

The Israeli-born conductor-pianist has directed the New York Philharmonic's Young People's Concerts for CBS-TV for four years.

Oct. 12—The De Vries Guitar Trio, virtuoso musicians from Vienna, mingle modern and antique instruments for renditions of classical and flamenco pieces.

Nov. 10—Ensemble for Early Music performs "La Roman de Fauvel," a medieval theatrical experience filled with music, puppets, processions and magic.

Dec. 1—Soprano Shirley Verrett comes to Detroit following performances with the Metropolitan Opera, La Scala, Concert Garden and the Paris Opera.

Feb. 22—Award-winning violinist Pinchas Zukerman and his wife, Eugenia, an acclaimed artist, are together for their first American tour.

April 18—Van Cliburn, winner of the Tchaikovsky Competition, will appear.
