## Franklin downs S. Farmington

Franklin's All Stars won the District 11 Pony League tournament, July 22-23 at Garden City, and earned the right to advance to the state finals which will begin July 29 at Walnut Lake.

Chris Vogt pitched the Franklin team to a 4-1 victory over South Farmington in the finals. Vogt struck out 11 batters and allowed but five hits.

Franklin jumped in front in the first inning on a single by Rick Hawkins, followed

by a double off the bat of Tim Meyer and a single by Jordan Kieber.

A series of unearned runs and a solo home run from Chris Sabel of South Farmington tied the game at four runs apiece.

Franklin then broke the contest open with a four-run fifth inning. Bob Barnett started the rally with a double. Greg Kiehl followed with a single. Vogt was hit with a pitched ball, and Hawkins loaded the bases with a walk. Meyer doubled in

three runs. He ended the game with three hits in five appearances and four runs batted in.

The Franklin stars entered the tournament finals by defeating South Farmington 4-1 in the quarter-final game on July 22. Vogt pitched a two-hitter in this game. Key hits were turned in by Jim Cornsall, who belted a two-run single, and Jim Ervold, who hit a solo home run.

Hawkins led the Franklin hitters in the tournament with a .375 average and was followed by Meyer's .368 performance. Other members of the Franklin team are Bob Rusk, Tom Finn, Greg Kierak, Bill Johnson, Al Perschino, Mike Silverstone and Paul Sabel.

### Tennis finals set for Sunday

Men's singles competition is being held in the following age groups: 10-12 years, 13-15, 16 and 17, 18-29, and over 30. There is also competition for women from 18 to 29 years of age, a women's doubles and mixed doubles.

Most of the entries are from Farmington and Farmington Hills.

## Club swimmers seek meet title

Some of the best young swimmers from the Detroit Metropolitan area will be on hand for the 37th annual Michigan Inter-Club Swimming Association championship meet this weekend at Plum Hollow Golf Club in Southfield.

The meet should attract more than 500 swimmers from the 14 teams in the MICA, according to meet director Don Stevens. Preliminaries begin at 10 a.m. on Saturday (July 31) with the competition in the events beginning at 2 p.m. The finals are scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. on Sunday (Aug. 1).

"I would have to say that DVC is the favorite again," Jones said. "They won the league meet last year, and best us by 35 points in this summer's dual meet. That Grosse Pointe Yacht Club is another solid team. They beat us by two points in the dual meet."

"But don't count us out. Plum Hollow has a history of swimming well in the championship meet. And having the meet in our home pool will be a big advantage for us."

Some outstanding Plum Hollow swimmers are: Stacy Kohn of Southfield in the 15-16 backstroke and butterfly, Scott Tyler of Birmingham in the 15-16 freestyle, Jay Jones of Southfield in the 15-16 freestyle and fly, and Lynda Stevens of West Bloomfield in the 11-12 backstroke.

Other MICA teams include Bloomfield Hunt Club, Larchmont Country Club, Dearborn Country Club, Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, Red Run Country Club, Western Golf and Country Club, Birmingham Athletic Club, Detroit Golf Club, Country Club of Detroit, Grosse Pointe Hunt Club and Oakland Hills Country Club.

Some 40 events will be held for boys and girls in four age groups — eight years and under, nine and 10, 11-12, and 13-14.

Detroit Yacht Club, which won last year's meet with 580 team points, should be the team to beat again this year, many coaches believe. Plum Hollow last year's runner up, and Grosse Pointe Yacht Club are also highly rated.

Grosse Pointe Yacht Club has won the dual-meet competition with a 4-0 record. Coach John Stires' Detroit Yacht Club team finished with a 4-1 mark. Plum Hollow, coached by Mike Jones, compiled a 4-2 record, having lost meets to DVC and GPCV.
