

Legion to play in Mack tourney

Troy-Birmingham clinched a berth in the American Legion one tournament on Terry Schultz's two-hour Friday night, ending the regular season as the 11th District's top representative.

Coach Tom Lohmeyer finished with a 26-31 record, one-half game ahead of Chad Peltier, which was 20-36. Both teams advance to the semi-finals, while Berkeley (11-11) and Farmington (11-12) will compete in the consolation Mack tournament.

Farmington, despite its under .500 record, advanced as a result of a political handicap. Lake Orion (13-19) possessed the best record, but was left out since the Mack tournament organizers want the second

and fourth-best teams. They closed the season with identical 4-1 records over Farmington, which extended its losing streak to six with a doubleheader loss to Waterford on Sunday.

On Wednesday, Brad Brettschneider hauled a three-run inning and Jose Cruz's home run to win 4-1. Other runs batted in were collected by Marc Saccotino, Doug Smith and Joe Georger.

On Friday, Schultz fanned nine and walked two, evening his record at 1-1. The win clinched the legion championship for Troy. A junior from Troy High, Schultz, had excellent stuff and the Farmington hitters off guard all day.

Farmington took a 1-0 lead off Schultz in the first inning on a walk, a fly out and a

single, but were blasted the rest of the way. Schultz pitched gem was another boost for Lohmeyer's staff. In 159 innings, Troy's pitching has given up 46 runs, 54 hits, fanned 175 and walked only 51.

Joe Georger leads the pack with a 64-run total. He earned run average, he's followed by Mike Murphy (4.1), Mark Pomroy, Brettschneider, Don Smith and Schultz.

TOM LANE'S team finished with a 3-19 record.

With the 24-game schedule ending Sunday for all three area teams, only Troy-Birmingham is still alive. Both Rochester and Auburn Heights will call it quits until next year.

As for Troy, it is looking forward to the legion tournament. Stated for Aug. 13, the host field will likely be Pontiac's Jaycee and Winner parks. Six teams will battle for the championship trophy in a two-game elimination format. The winner will advance to the state finals in Jackson, with the champion then going to Lafayette, Ind., for the regionals.

Notice of Intent to issue \$200,000 of Industrial Revenue Bonds for Douglas and Lomax Company approved unanimously.

Consent judgement and preliminary approval for Farmington Green Subdivision located in the northwest corner of 12 Mile and Drake Roads unanimously approved.

S.A.D. established for sewer improvement on Greening Street from Barlow to Burdick Streets.

Authorization granted and redemption schedule approved to call outstanding bonds in Special Assessment Districts 23, 27, 28, 29, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37 and 38.
