

18 Polish bishops visit area

Eighteen members of the Catholic Church hierarchy from Poland will spend the third day of a four-day visit to the area at an all-day Polish Conference on the Orchard Lake campus of St. Mary College.

During the conference, Thursday, Aug. 12, Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Krakow, delegation leader, will discuss his church-state relations in Poland. Other bishops will lecture on vocations, the laity, religious education of youth, and education of adults in Poland.

A press conference by the group will follow on Friday at Orchard Lake. Prior to these events, the Polish bishops attended an Orchard Lake dinner to honor St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary, St. Mary College and St. Mary Preparatory School, all of Orchard Lake. Seven hundred attended.

Following the press conference, the bishops will go their separate ways to 17 areas of the country. Bishops Jerry Stronski of the Diocese of Sacramento-Klamath and Bishop Zdzislaw Krasowski of the Diocese of Krakow will remain in Michigan.

At 7 p.m. Friday, Aug. 13 they will offer mass at St. Mary Church in Parvaville, considered the oldest Polish parish in the state.

The pair will tour the Detroit Riverfront Polish Festival on Saturday. At 3 p.m. they will participate in the Mass at St. Stanislaus Church, Detroit, and Bishop Zdzislaw Krasowski will perform the homily.

After other duties in the Detroit area and Grand Rapids, they will spend Monday relaxing at Orchard Lake before departing Tuesday to meet the entire delegation in Buffalo.

Pastoral ministry program set

A certificate program in pastoral ministry beginning this fall has been announced by St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary, Orchard Lake.

The program, which is available on either a full or part-time basis, is designed for religious brothers, nuns and laity who are presently working in, or are planning to enter such specialized ministries as the parish, hospital or campus.

Those making a transition from one form of ministry to another.

Those remaining in the same ministry but wanting a year of reflection and renewal.

Those entering a specialized ministry for the first time.

Those wanting to develop further pastoral skills or needing support in the direction of their current ministry.

The training program will have four integrated components. Middleton said. They include theological training, community formation and development of pastoral skills, supervised field education, and ongoing theological reflection.

Middleton, who is the Seminary's continuing education director and a member of the faculty, said that the certificate program is in response to the variety of new forms of ministry which have developed in the Catholic Church in recent years.

"The traditional parish ministry has undergone profound transformation," Middleton said. "Many dedicated religious brothers, sisters, and laity find themselves called upon to serve the parish as a pastoral associate or ministerial assistant or youth minister or some other form of parish leadership."

Middleton said that the certificate program aims to develop the gifts and talents of these dedicated people for more effective work.

"Through this program we hope to assist the development and formation of these servants as dynamic Christian leaders who will bring the love of Christ to the People of God," Middleton said.

St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary is one of the three academic institutions which comprise the Orchard Lake Schools, the

others being St. Mary's College, and St. Mary's Preparatory, all located on the same 130-acre lakeside campus.

Course offered sewing buffs

Sewing is definitely not a bygone art, according to a recent U.S. Department of Agriculture survey.

The survey reveals that 41 million persons nationwide probably do some home sewing. And Americans spend an estimated \$4 billion each year on fabrics, patterns, sewing machines and notions.

Among the ranks of home sewers are the 4-H leaders and members who participate in the national 4-H sewing machine program. Supported by The Singer Company through the National 4-H Sewing Machine Committee, the program provides an opportunity for leaders—volunteers, teens and juniors—to improve their teaching skills. And it gives 4-Hers 9-18 practical experience in using and caring for a sewing machine.

The training course is taught by Cooperative Extension Service personnel, with the aid of instructional literature developed by Singer, the Extension Service and the Service Committee.

Two illustrated member manuals, "Know the Sewing Machine" and "Master the Sewing Machine," were published last year, and a leader's guide is expected to be available this fall.

Following the manual step-by-step instructions, the beginning sewer learns how to operate the machine and stitch basic seams. More advanced sewers can master machine regulation and rag-tag stitching.

Girls and boys in the 4-H sewing machine program acquire the skills needed to turn out clothing, accessories, home furnishings, and hobby or craft items.

Saving money is a major reason for 4-Hers' interest in sewing. An added incentive is the desire for clothing and other items that are personalized and better constructed than ready-made.

More information on the national 4-H sewing machine program is available from county extension agents.

Presbyterian village offered Kresge grant

Presbyterian Village of Detroit, Inc., a retirement complex for the elderly, has been selected for a challenge grant of \$100,000 from The Kresge Foundation for the completion of the building of the new 64-bed Memorial Hall on its site at 1780 Garfield, in Redford Township.

Word of the grant was received recently in a letter from William H. Baldwin, president of the foundation.

Payment of the grant is subject to Presbyterian Village raising the balance of the funds required for the project. With this addition, and other buildings now being completed on the site, Presbyterian Village will have a potential population of 201 residents.

Presbyterian Village is an agency of the Presbytery of Detroit governed by a board of trustees elected from the geographic area it serves.

The area served encompasses all of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties and parts of Wabash, Livingston and St. Clair counties. Its services include supervisory care for well-aged residents and nursing care for the infirm.
