

Southfield man receives award

William I. Liberson of Southfield will be honored by his synagogue and the State of Israel Bond organization at a Tribute Dinner on Sept. 19 in Congregation Beth Achim's Social Hall.

Liberson, a Beth Achim leader and supporter of the bond appeal will receive the coveted State of Israel Koah Award to be presented for "outstanding service in the Israel Bond program."

The Hebrew letters "koah" represent the number 28, signifying the 28th anniversary of Israel, said Beth Achim president Allan Silverman of Southfield.

Koah also means strength, and Liberson, Silverman said, "must be able to negotiate for peace from a position of strength not only militarily, but economically as well."

"As over 30 per cent of Israel's gross national product is used for defense expenditures (as against 6 per cent in the U.S.) the tiny democracy," continued Silverman, "depends on Israel Bond proceeds to supply the major share of its \$1 billion economic development budget."

"IN HONORING BILL Liberson through the purchase of Israel Bonds, Bill's friends and fellow congregants will be fulfilling their commitment to the survival of Israel, as in their way, the Hebrew Israeli resists at Entebbe fulfilled their commitment," Silverman said.

The honoree has a lengthy record of devotion to Israel and his community. Liberson has served as president of Congregation Beth Achim. He is a member of the Speakers Bureau of State of Israel Bonds and the board of the Hebrew Benevolent Society.

He is also active in B'nai B'rith and the Jewish War Veterans. He serves on the boards of the Opera Organization, Brighton Hospital and the Liberty State Bank and Trust.

Liberson, a graduate of Wayne State University and the Detroit College of Law, is a partner in the law firm of Liberson and Crystal.

A native Detroit, he and his wife, Annette, are the parents of three daughters.

Louise is a political science graduate of Oakland University. Her husband, Neil Granader, has a doctorate in anatomy from the University of Michigan and will teach on the faculty of the University of Missouri Medical School.

ALICE is a University of Michigan graduate and attends the veterinarian college at Michigan State where Beth, the youngest, is a sophomore. Mrs. Liberson, a graduate of Wayne State, is now working on her M.A. in vocational rehabilitation counseling.

The Libersons have made several trips to Israel and all of their daughters speak Hebrew.

Steven I. Victor of Bloomfield Hills, chairman of the dinner committee states that an exciting program is being planned for the event.

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Burdick hits spending

Congress has cost the taxpayers \$1 billion dollars over the past two years, just for its administration, said James Burdick keynote speaker at the fall convention of the 17th District Republican Congressional Committee and candidate for the 17th District Congressional seat.

Burdick maintained that Democratic control of Congress over the past 10 years is responsible for increased taxes and inflation for the working man. "Just to pay taxes, the average citizen works all of January, February, March and within 24 hours of April 15, the rest of his money goes to pay inflated food prices, exorbitant interest on mortgage, and excessively high costs of gasoline."

Burdick pointed out that the Republican record offered a more responsible approach to government spending and the elimination of needless regulation and interference with personal freedoms.

Burdick expressed dissatisfaction with the failure of Congress to pass the wide sweeping reforms promised in the wake of Watergate.

All of the committee chairman, who were the least bit sensible, financially and otherwise, were driven from their positions. In their places we got less responsible, but far more vocal would be leaders, he said.

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
