Now all of that has changed. While there may be many a slip between now and November, there is the feeling all around that this year's team that opens the season against Wisconsin on Sept. 11 is Rose Bowl bound.

The leader of the optimistic group is hockey Kirk Lewis, the former Garden City West star, who missed last season because of injuries.

He was to have his career in the stadium last year. But injuries in the practice sessions caused him to miss the entire campaign.

Now with that year of eligibility left, he decided to take a leave from medical school and rejoin the squad for what he called "a chance to play in the Rose Bowl."

Kirk is the co-captain this year and his driving force and optimism should help. But Bo Schenbeckler, the coach who is back in great command, also has expressed opinion that the 1976 team should rank with the best.

His optimism is based on the fact that 13 starters on the 1975 team are returning and that none of them are on the offensive squad.

Aside from Kirk Lewis' return, Bo has shifted Walt Downing, a 250-pounder from Coatsville, Pa. to middle guard to bolster the defense.

But the main theme of the Wolverines this year is speed.

"This is one of the fastest teams we've ever had," one of the UM officials stated, "and unless something happens, these boys should show us something."

One of the most ambitious of the lot is Rob Lyle, the senior from Fremont, Ohio who has been a star on offense for the past two seasons.

He needs to gain 125 pounds to hit Billy Taylor's rushing records of 307 yards. And the feeling, as the team reported for

picture day on Saturday is that Rob is the type who can do it.

With Lyle in the backfield will be Rick Leach, the young quarterback who starred a year ago as a freshman and one from Bo claims will be better this year. Russell Davis, a husky sophomore from Woodbridge, Va., and Jim Smith, who was shifted from his end position last year.

Stroh's title is Snyder's 7th this year

The tournament, championship was the seventh for Snyder's so far this season.
