

G.R. Mosher resigns from OCC post

George R. Mosher of Birmingham, an Oakland Community College trustee since the school's inception in 1964, has resigned from the OCC Board of Trustees.

Mosher, a General Motors Corp. patent attorney, said outside pressures made it impossible for him to devote as much time as necessary to board duties and his resignation was the result.

A replacement to complete the remaining two years of Mosher's six-year term will be selected by the OCC board.

Mosher was the first chairman of the OCC board, serving from 1964-1972, when he voluntarily relinquished the position which was subsequently filled by Gordon C. Henderson.

Both Mosher and his wife Doris were active on committees supporting the establishment of the community college prior to 1964 when it opened its doors.

The board, which accepted Mosher's resignation Aug. 19, intends to name a building in his honor.

No or low expenses in 64th

Brotherton (R-Farmington) was unopposed in the Aug. 9 Republican primary. So far, he has personally received and spent nothing.

Police hit roof on fraud

Birmingham police Tuesday warned area residents that a home repair fraud reportedly is starting in Oakland County.

Li Jack Kabisch said there have been reports of a pair of men who offer to make roof repairs by telling the residents:

usually elderly, that the city will condemn the property if the roof goes bad.

He suggests that residents faced with the request delay by saying they must check with another family member and that they then notify their local police department. The police and building department will investigate, he said.

This type of fraud usually is a spring-time operation, he said, but there have been incidents reported in Oakland County.

Job rate predicted

Unemployment in Oakland County is high, but it could get better over the next four years if the area isn't hit by a recession.

That's the prediction made by the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations (ILIR), which made unemployment forecasts for areas which are prime sponsors of manpower programs throughout the state. The report was sponsored by the Bureau of Employment and Training, Michigan Department of Labor.

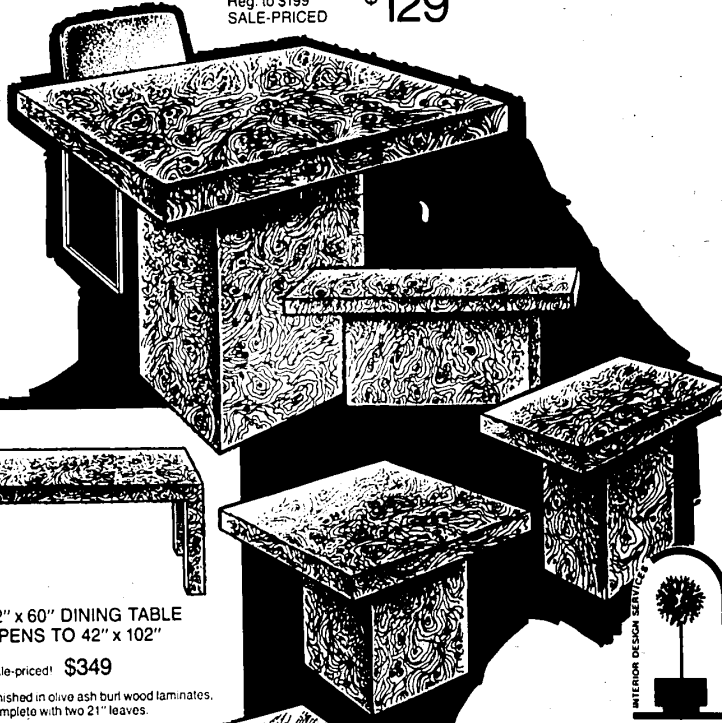
ILIR is sponsored by the University of Michigan and Wayne State University. Malcolm Cohen, director of the ILIR project, says that Oakland County's unemployment rate will average 10.3 per cent in 1976 and decline to 8.4 per cent in 1980. But if a recession hits the rate will be more like 13.8 per cent in 1980, he adds.

According to Cohen, the reason the county has such a high unemployment rate even under good conditions is due to Pontiac.
