## Artists to exhibit at park art fair

Several local artists will be among the outstanding Michigan artists and craftspersons who will display their work at the annual Lafayette Park Art Fair, Sept. 11 and 12. The Fair will be held in the Towers Shopping Plaza on East Lafayette and Orleans near downtown Detroit.

Participating will be William and Florence Featherston of Bloomfield Hills, fiber sculpture; Shari Cohen of Southfield, jewelry; Margie Kaechle of Birmingham, jewelry; Rick Burger, tempera and acrylic paintings and Sonia Molnar, watercolors, both of Troy; Kathy T. Dambach of Birmingham, ceramics; and Bill Nagenst, Jr. of Bloomfield Hills, porcelain pottery.

The Lafayette Park Art Fair is recognized as one of the highest quality art events in Michigan. This year more applications were submitted than ever before.

A jury composed of Richard Koslow, a Michigan artist, and Charles McGee of Gallery Seven, made their selections from more than 250 applicants.

Fiber, ceramics, sculpture, drawings, paintings, prints, photography, glassware, jewelry and toys are among the art forms to be displayed.

The Fair opens at 10 a.m. and closes at 6 p.m. both Saturday and Sunday. Special attractions include art auctions at 3 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday and art activities for young visitors from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. both days.

Linda Grossman and Judy Harris are in charge of this year's event. They direct a volunteer group of Lafayette Park and Elmwood Park residents who organize and sponsor the Fair.

## Teacher conference set for Beth El

The Jewish Educators Council of Metropolitan Detroit is sponsoring its annual Teacher's Conference beginning at 9 a.m. on Sept. 12 at Temple Beth El.

Rabbi Irwin E. Witry, director of the Board of Jewish Education in Toronto and Dean of the Midrash L'morash will be the guest lecturer. Rabbi Witry serves as the vice-president of the National Council of Jewish Education and of the B'nai B'rith Zionsists of Canada. He has lectured widely to communities in this country and in Canada.

Scheduled to speak at 9:30 a.m., Dr. Witry's subject will be "Leading Students to Commitment." There will also be a series of seminars and discussions led by local Jewish educators.

Seminar topics to be covered are: The Teaching of History, Prayer, Hebrew and Bible. Workshops will deal with teaching in the primary department, a junior high school elective program, the Holocaust, teaching Israel, individualizing Jewish education, a problem clinic in discipline and teaching Bar and Bat Mitzvah students.

The public is invited to the institute and there will be a registration fee.
