### Red Cross course begins Sept. 23

There is a \$3 fee for the course. Senior citizens, from 60 and older aren't charged the fee. The Red Cross Handbook and bandages are available for \$2.50 at the first class meeting. A first aid certificate will be awarded upon completion of the course. The class will explain how to cope with

bleeding, shock, fractures, breathing stoppage and other common emergencies.
