ADMISSION

All credit courses offered through the College of Lifelong Learning are open to qualified students. Those students who have been fully admitted to Wayne State University for a program of study (either graduate or undergraduate) and are in good standing will have the course credits and grades recorded on their transcripts. Those who have not been fully admitted to a degree program at Wayne State University will be registered as non-matriculated.

REGISTRATION

Starting September 7, persons may register at the WSU office in the Birmingham Center for Continuing Education weekdays from 8:30-5:00 p.m. Hours during final registration (September 23, 24, and 27) will be 8:30-6:30 p.m.

Please do not expect a mailed acknowledgment of your registration; simply go to the classes selected at the time and place scheduled. An official record of your enrollment will be forwarded to you later in the quarter.

NON-CREDIT OFFERINGS

1. University Courses in Adult Education
 A cooperative enterprise in university level non-credit courses of Wayne State University's College of Lifelong Learning and The University of Michigan Extension Service, has had courses in Detroit, Dearborn, and Ann Arbor for over 20 years. We think it is the most interesting, most authoritative adult education program anywhere. 2. Non-Matriculated (Non-Admitted) Students

Fee for graduate and undergraduate credit is \$30.00 per credit hour.

Students electing programs of less than five credit hours must pay the full applicable fee when registering.

Payment of all fees by check, or money order payable to Wayne State University must accompany registration materials. A student whose check is not honored must re-register, subject to all penalties. CASH CANNOT BE ACCEPTED. Students may also use Master Charge cards to pay their tuition assessments. Students using this option and registering by mail must copy on a separate sheet of paper all the information indicated on their Master Charge card.

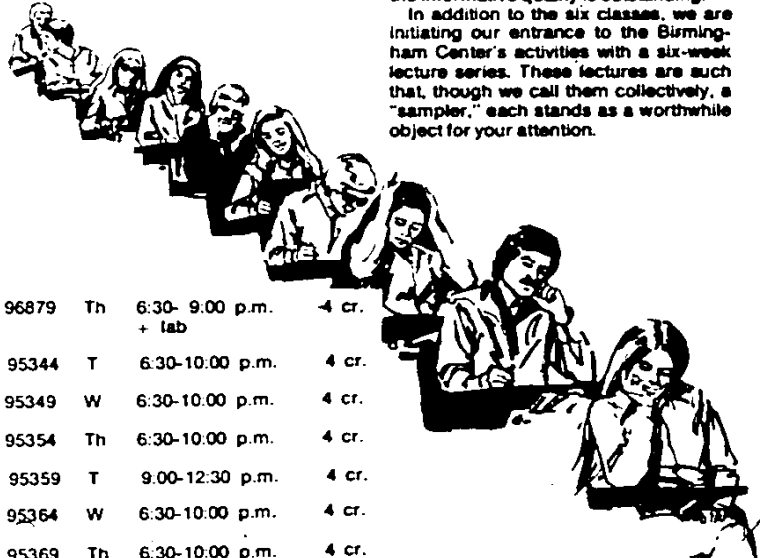
