2. Non-Matriculated (Non-Admitted),

Fee for graduate and undergraduate credit is \$30.00 per credit hour.

Students electing programs of less than five credit hours must pay the full applicable fee when registering.

Payment of all fees by check, or money order payable to Wayne State University must accompany registration materials. A student whose check is not honored must re-register, subject to all penatties. CASH CANNOT BE ACCEPTED. Students may also use Master Cherge cards to pay their tuition assessments.
