The hand in the diagram was dealt at a local club game. The East-West players were experts and the North-South players relative beginners. Nancy Yax of Romeo and Gert Band of Madison Heights held the North-South cards. When Gert's two club opening bid was overcalled in diamonds, Nancy technically does not have a free bid. The experts agree that to make a positive response to a strong bid you must hold a least eight high card points or seven if your hand contains an ace.

West led the nine of clubs. Nancy bid spades knowing she was short in point count, but her partner's strong hand gave her courage. West tried to hinder communication by his notrump call and subsequently bid seven diamonds against the vulnerable small slam.

Gert would have been content to bid the small slam but when West bid seven diamonds crossed her fingers and bid seven spades.

Nancy played the club ace, drew the opponents trump and tested the heart suit. When it split 3-3, she had to do was trump two diamonds in dummy.
