# Clarenceville '11' falls

CLARENCEVILLE-ROBICHAUD

A couple of freak touchdowns played by Dearborn Heights Robichaud last weekend spoiled Clarenceville's 1978 football debut as the Trojans fell to the Bulldogs in overtime, 19-12.

Merrett Bryson put Robichaud in front in the first period when the quarterback concluded a 50-yard touchdown drive with a five-yard run. The kick failed.

On the ensuing kickoff, Clarenceville's Tim McCamant, taking advantage of good blocking and breaking several tackles, returned the ball up the middle 78 yards for a touchdown. The extra-point effort was not good.

Robichaud scored again on the final play of the half on a 45-yard touchdown pass. Two Clarenceville defenders were in position to break up the play, but the two col-

lided enabling the receiver to have exclusive access to the northern pylon.

Clarenceville stopped the two-point attempt. The Trojans knotted the score in the third quarter when quarterback Jim Bryer completed a 16-yard pass to McCamant in the Bulldogs' endzone. The conversion failed.

That Clarenceville touchdown was set-up when Matt Prisk blocked a punt at the Robichaud 35-yard line.

Clarenceville had scoring chances later in the second half, but neither could cross the other's goal during regulation time.

The Bulldogs' winning touchdown, scored during their first possession of the overtime, was even more freakish than their first.

Bryson's pass from Clarenceville's 10-yard line was batted down by McCamant. Unfortunately for the Trojans, Robichaud's Oscar Kendall was in the area where the ball was batted and he snatched it in the

The Patriots scored their only touchdown on a 29-yard gallop around right end by Phil Vuhasz. The run capped a 53-yard drive for Franklin. The two-point conversion attempt failed.

Vuhasz gained 73 yards in 15 carries for Franklin, and was, in the words of Vigna, the Patriots' only bright spot.

"Basically, I feel that our inexperience hurt a lot more than expected," the Franklin coach said. "We made a lot of foolish mental errors."

"We did move the ball and it looks like the line did an adequate job," Vigna added. "I guess we have to regroup and go back to work."
