# Falcons outrun Stevenson

Farmington High lifted its cross country record to 5-0 with a 22-33 victory over Livonia Stevenson in an Inter Lakes League meet last Thursday afternoon at Farmington's Oakland Community College course.

Farmington's Harold Rutla won the race, finishing the three mile run in 16:01. Stevenson's Bill Wilun was second in 16:08. The next three finishers, all Farmington runners, were Stuart Glatfelter (16:26), Hugh Leiden (16:32) and Paul McKinnon (16:45).

**Dooders—Lathrup**

Royal Oak Dooders nipped Southfield-Lathrup, 27-28, last Thursday in a Metro Suburban Association cross country meet at Lathrup's Lawrence Institute of Technology home course. The loss left Lathrup with a 2-2 overall record.

Dooders' Ron Lessard finished first in 16:17. Larry King and Dave Thomas, both of Lathrup, took second and third in 16:26.

Southfield's best performance came from Bob Church, who finished fifth in 16:58. Other Southfield runners and their times: Scott Brandon (16:49), Dennis Sleep (16:51), and Steve Hyman (16:49).

**N. Farmington—W.L. Western**

North Farmington upped its cross country record to 2-1 with a 27-30 victory over Walled Lake Western Sept. 21 at Oakland Community College.

North Farmington's Dave Good took first in 15:56, and Western's Mike Mayes was second in 16:09. North runners took fifth through ninth: Paul Welch, Mike Spengler, Rich Stumpf, Dave Kocielnik and Jeff Temple.

**Mott—Harrison**

Farmington Harrison, under new coach Jack Inch, dropped two cross country meets last week. Waterford Mott bested Harrison, 44-35, last Thursday in a Western Six League contest at Mott. Mark Evans of Harrison won in 15:53, a Mott course record. Teammate Charlie Rogers finished third in 16:46. Harrison's Mike Foley was ninth in 16:15, a personal best.

Earlier, Thurston defeated Harrison, 22-29, in a non-league meet at Gas Benta Park. Evans finished first in 16:58. The two losses dropped Harrison to 0-4 overall.

# Falcon swimmers triumph

Farmington High's girls' swimming team showed that it's going to be a squad to be reckoned with by beating Southfield-Lathrup, 92-70, last Thursday afternoon in Farmington's pool.

Lathrup took seven first places to Farmington's four, but the Falcons showed superior depth. The 100-yard backstroke was a key event for Farmington, which took the first three places. Cindy Nobel won in 1:15.8, Cathy Lewis took second and Ellen Bunting, was third.

"We were winning by only three points before that event," said Farmington coach Mark Holdridge, who took over as the Falcons' coach this season. "After that we went up by 13 points with only two events left."

Farmington's Casey Ratliff won two events, tying one school record and breaking another. Her 27.3 in the 50 freestyle tied a varsity mark, and her 1:07.0 in the 100 free set a standard. Nancy Dahlstrom also broke a school record by finishing second in the 500 free in 8:24.82.

Harrison, which took six firsts, had outstanding performances from the Rudel sisters, Karen and Cathy. Karen won the 200 IM (2:26.28) and the 500 free (5:59.7), while Cathy took the 200 free (2:09.12) and the 100 butterfly (1:04.7). The Rudel sisters teamed with Lori Pfaffman and Linda Lahey to win the 100 free relay in a school record 4:12.9. Harrison diver Denise Hale won that event with 163.90 points.

Farmington also won the 400 freestyle relay in 4:13.7. The team consists of Laurie Dahlstrom, Nancy Dahlstrom, Ratliff and Cathy Gregoire. Farmington's depth was evident in the diving event. Lathrup's Bridget Clancy won with 127.0 points, but Farmington took second and third with Sue MacKinnon (119.3 points) and Cathy Bondi (118.95).

Lathrup's Laura Crosswaite was a standout winning the 100 butterfly (1:06.1) and the 200 freestyle (2:01.8). Teammate Lisa Hess also won two individual events: the 200 individual (2:28.4) and the 100 breaststroke (1:19.7). Linda Carter won the 500 free (6:29.1), and Lathrup's 200 medley relay (Tracy Andrews, Hess, Crosswaite and Jeri Sattler) won in 2:03.

Earlier last week, Lathrup nipped Livonia Bentley, 85-44, in a non-league meet at Bentley. Lathrup won the meet by finishing second in the 400 free relay. The relay: Linda Carter, Kim Carter, Nancy Finzel and Debbie Johnston recorded a 4:29.2.

**W.L. Western—Harrison**

Walled Lake Western defeated Farmington Harrison, 107-63, in a Western Six League girls' swimming meet last Thursday. Coach Cathy Suchyta's Harrison team is 0-2 this season.
