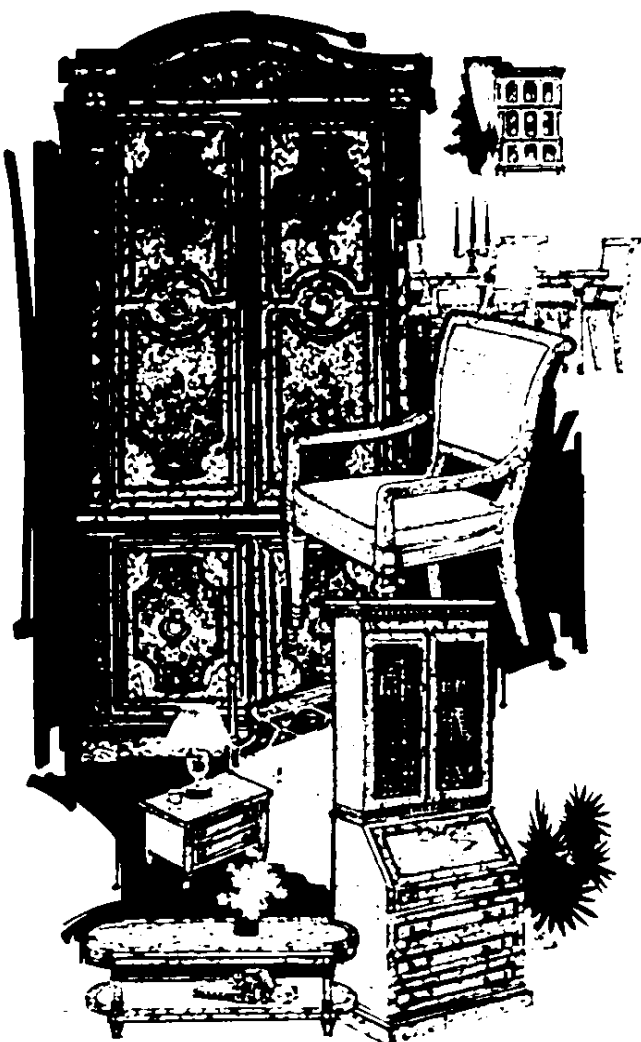

contemporary," Goldberg said.

A former sunroom-porch was extended with floor-to-ceiling tinted glass walls, and three skylights were added for more light. A monochromatic scheme was chosen to help pull the three rooms (kitchen, porch and family room) together.

Strong patterns in the rug and upholstery fabric in the skylit room contrasts with the room adjacent with its bright orange hand-woven rug and sombre-color upholstered sofas. Touches of contemporary and classical art and accessories in each room make them interesting.

A fireplace is the central focal point for the area. It has a natural-wood chevron panelling around it. The same tiles which appear on an alcove wall in the kitchen are repeated for congruity on the skylight room dining and game table.

Red marble used as the hearth is used again as the countertop for the center island in the kitchen where two adults can grab a fast meal.

Goldberg, like Ms. Fuller, added recessed lighting in the whole area for mood setting and delineation of room boundaries. The room is successful enough that the family may never need that "more formal living room."
