

# Area swimming standings

For the past 10 years, domination has been the name of the game for coach DeLoe Vager and her Farmington Our Lady of Mercy swimming team.

Mrs. Vager has coached Mercy to 122 straight dual meet victories and 10 straight Catholic League championships. And the 1978 Marlins started strong by beating public school for West Bloomfield, 99-73, last Thursday in the Lakemere pool.

In winning, Mercy logged six state meet qualifying times. Betsy Leahy, a freshman, set a school record in the 200 and 400 freestyle with a 2:04.0 clocking. Sue MacMillan was a double winner, taking the 200 individual medley (2:21.6) and the 100 butterfly (1:04.7). Carol Kolon won the 500 freestyle in 5:52.8.

Both Mercy relays won with state qualifying times. The 200 medley relay (Sue Miller, Theresa Burton, Sue Kolon and Ann Fisher) finished first in 2:01.0 and the 400 freestyle relay (Leahy, Sue Kolon

MacMillan and Kara Johnson) won in 3:53.3.

"It's a very strong team," Mrs. Vager said. "We should win the Catholic League title again and do well in the state meet, too. We have 21 freshmen on the team, and that's a lot for us. They should keep the program going if they all come back next year."

## Lathrup-Berkley

Southfield Lathrup defeated Berkley 16-8, 92-80, in a non-league swimming meet. Berkley was leading until the diving event, where Lathrup went one-two with Brad Clancy winning with 127 points and Ramon Mansfield taking second with 125.

"What made me happy was that our girls never gave up," said Lathrup coach Pete Beglin, whose team is 2-1 this season. When you get behind, there's a tendency to slow down, but our kids kept trying."

At least a double winner, taking the 200 free in 2:08.0 and the 500 free in 5:37.8. Teammate Laura Croshaw won the 100 fly in 1:04.0. Lathrup's 400 free relay (Croshaw, Lisa, Beth Nishelson and Debbie Johnston) won in 4:05.5.

Any Rose of Berkley won the 100 free, 1:02.7.

Maureen Jewell, Debbi Hatch and Patty Gasser each won two individual events in leading North Farmington to a 96-74 victory over Farmington High last Thursday in the Raiders' pool.

Jewell won the 200 IM (2:23.9) and the 100 fly (1:04.1). Hatch took the 50 free (26.3) a pool and varsity record and the 100 free (1:38.1). Gasser finished first in the 200 free (2:14.8) and the 500 free (6:12.0). Berta Nielson won the 100 backstroke in 1:17.7 for North Farmington, which won 10 of the 11 events.

Farmington's Sue Sterling won the 100 breaststroke in 1:30.7.

Denise Bole of Harrison won the diving event with 144.0 points. The victory left coach Cathy Suchyta's Harrison team with a 13 record.

## Planners will review college

Southfield Planning Commission will review the request of Detroit Bible College for a change of use of the former Anglin Road School on Franklin Road at a Wednesday night meeting at 8 p.m.

The college wants to use the school building as a college building.

Nathan Levine and Associates Inc. will seek approval for a master plan development on the south side of Twelve Mile between Northwestern and Telegraph in other expected commission action.

The developers want to build a 190-unit apartment — 70 units for senior citizens, 120 units for conventional multiple-unit apartment, 43,000 square feet of retail space, 107,000 square feet of office space, and a 200-room hotel. The company received approval for their original plan over two years ago. This is a revised on which the commission will be deliberating.

Also on the planning commission agenda is a request from B.K. Southfield Development Company to build a Burger King Restaurant on the south side of Twelve Mile between Northwestern and Case.

The land is zoned for general business. The last food carry-out restaurant is not considered a general business, according to Southfield zoning ordinances.
