

Sharp passing saves Farmington, 18-16

The Farmington High Waterford Township football game was full of exciting moments, but one of the most tense came with just 1:00 left in the game and Waterford's Jim Tuppen lining up a field goal try from the Farmington 15-yard line.

Tuppen's kick was way off the mark. Had the ball gone through the goalposts, Waterford probably would have won the game by a point. As it happened, Farmington took possession and ran out the clock to preserve its 18-16 victory in the Inter Lakes League game played last Friday afternoon as part of Farmington's homecoming festivities.

"I think we were fortunate to win," said Farmington coach Jack Beardsley after the game. Beardsley's Falcons lost to West Bloomfield (21-6) before finally making the win column last Friday.

"The kids needed this," he said. "They needed this first victory. We have a young team and they were kind of down after the West Bloomfield game."

Farmington's passing attack — 223 yards through 12 completions — was impressive. Quarterback Randy Meyer, a 6-2, 175-pound senior, passed for all three of Farmington's touchdowns. His favorite receiver was senior halfback Rick Mühler, who snagged five passes for 135 yards and two touchdowns.

Meyer's first touchdown pass went to Marty Bora and covered 47 yards in the third quarter. Meyer failed on the point-after-touchdown kick.

Waterford's Bob Jenko, an impressive runner, puffed the Sappers back into the lead by running 36 yards for a second-quarter touchdown and then passing to Tom Hieburn for the two-point conversion.

Waterford led, 8-6, at halftime. But Farmington wasted no time retaking the lead. Meyer connected with Mühler for a 40-yard scoring pass on the third play of the second half. A pass for the extra points failed. Waterford's Mark Smith pulled his team back into the lead when he scored on a one-yard plunge.

Jenko ran for the conversion points. With Waterford leading by four points (16-12), Meyer passed to Mühler for the last touchdown, a 45-yard play, with 9:21 left in the game. The run failed, but Farmington established the winning margin. Farmington's Mike Popp, a junior end, came up with a big defensive play late in the game, just before Waterford's errant field goal try. The 185-pound Popp tackled Skipper QB Rod Carofino for a loss to stop a late drive which had landed Waterford on the Falcon's 15.

Farmington plays next on Saturday (Oct. 9) at Livonia Stevenson. The Inter Lakes League game begins at 2 p.m.

Farmington runners ranked high

Coach Gerald Young has built something of a cross country dynasty at Farmington High School over the past three years.

Since late October of 1972, Young's Farmington teams have won 28-straight dual meets and two Inter Lakes League titles. This season's team has six straight victories to its credit, looks like the strongest yet. The 1974 Falcons were rated the fifth-best Class A team in Michigan, according to a poll conducted by a panel of coaches and published in the "Cross Country Invitational Results."

Farmington proved it deserved the high ranking by beating Northville High, 31-15, Sept. 28 at Oakland Community College. Northville had been ranked eighth in the same poll.

Farmington took the first three places with junior Harold Rutala winning in 15:58. Stuart Glatfelter and Hugh Lindgren followed with times of 18:15 and 18:17 respectively. Northville's Bob Gould finished fourth in 18:21.

Last Thursday, Farmington defeated Washed Lake Central, 20-7, in an Inter Lakes League meet. Glatfelter and Rutala finished one-two, both with 18:18 times. Gerald's Dan Turner was third in 18:21 and Leiden and Farmington's Paul McKinnon took fourth (18:29) and fifth (18:30).

Lathrup-Lathrup

Southfield Lathrup defeated Bloomfield Hills Lathrup, 20-7, in a Metro Suburban Association cross country meet last Thursday at Lathrup. Lathrup took the first three places with Larry King (18:43), Dave Thomas (18:44) and Dave Clifford (17:04). Lathrup's Dan Pamperin took fourth in 17:16, and Jason Stewart of Lathrup was fifth in 17:40.

The victory left Lathrup 32 overall and 14 in the MSA.

Franklin-North Farmington

Livonia Franklin beat North Farmington, 23-34, in a Northwest Suburban League contest, but North coach Ed Davis lost more than just a cross country dual meet.

North's best runner, Dave Good, treated his ankle and "will be on crutches for awhile," according to Davis. Good was leading the pack going into the third mile when the mishap occurred. "It's one of those things," Davis said. "But Dave's a great runner and I'm sure he'll bounce back."

Franklin's George Hudock won the race with a 16:28 clicking, and teammate

Glen George was second in 16:34. North's Mike Springer took third in 16:57. Paul Welch, also of North Farmington, was fourth in 17:04.

North Farmington is 32 overall.

Seaborn-Southfield

Birmingham Seaborn stopped Southfield High, 17-30, in a Southeastern Michigan Association meet at Southfield.

Seaborn took the top three places with Steve Poston (18:40), Bob Phillips (18:52) and Greg Bell (18:56). Southfield's Bob Clark was fourth in 17:14, and teammate Scott Brandon finished eighth in 18:10. The loss left Southfield with an 0-2 record.

Christian-Country Day

Southfield Christian lifted its cross country dual meet record to 4-0 with a 22-33 victory over Detroit Country Day School last week. Christian's Bob Kuntzman and Kevin Larson finished one-two with clockings of 17:30 and 17:43 respectively. Country Day's Russ White was third in 17:52. Christian took fourth and fifth with Tom Johnson (18:07) and Doug Wright (18:12).

Churchill-Harrison

Farmington Harrison's Mark Evans led all runners with a 15:50, but Livonia Churchill bested the Hawks, 23-37, in a Western
