

The Cardinal will arrive from Canada Sept. 14 to begin his visit in Buffaio. He expects to be at Orchard Lake Sept. 23 after a stop in Detroit's Polish communities.

The Very Rev. Walter J. Ziemba, president rector of Orchard Lake Schools, is cochairing a special committee working out details of the cler-gyman's visit.

This is the first time that a Polish Catholic with the rank of Cardinal has visited in the United States. Cardinal Wojtyla plans to use
