They will discuss the administration and publicizing of election in Michigan and whether local units of government should do more to encourage voter registration.

Their discussion will include presidential primaries in Michigan, open primaries, and the problems of cross-over voting. And it will conclude with a section on the simplification of the ballot, asking if there might be too many elections in a calendar year, and whether judges and college trustees should be appointed rather than elected in order to shorten ballots.

In discussing these topics, the present Michigan law, the problems and possible solutions will be covered as part of the study program.

Local consensus will be taken next month and submitted to the state league office by Dec. 1. The state office will formulate a position based on the consensus of the 43 Michigan leagues.

Thereafter, the Michigan LWV will be able to lobby, and actively participate in formulating and supporting legislation, with position guidelines established by the grassroots leagues.
