A new bowling center, combining a lounge with dining and a full-line deli, is the first of its kind opening shortly in West Bloomfield.

The West Bloomfield Lane will open its 14 bowling lanes, plus the Billboard Lounge and the Market Deli, the first week in November.

Scheduled to open Monday is the Billboard Lounge, the grounds of Century Farms. The former riding stables has been transformed into an indoor riding ring and driving range, along with a restaurant and bar.

Bloomfield Charles is a Chuck Martin tavern restaurant, will open Nov. 10 on the site of the Ponderosa Steak House that was destroyed by tornado March 20. The new family restaurant is patterned after "Barnyard" Charles.

LARRY SIMMONS, one of the partners in West Bloomfield Lane, said the bowling

center they don't call them alley any more is the first to be built in West Bloomfield. He expects it will fill the area's needs for many years.

Simon also operates the WY7 bowling center and WY7 Annex at WY7 and Seven Mile in Detroit, which has been going since 1961.

A West Bloomfield resident for the last four years, Simon is in partnership with his father, Lawrence Simon of Royal Oak and Dave Goldman of Southfield.

The Billboard Lounge will be devoted with original old and new billboard advertisements. These billboards will adorn the walls, ceiling and bar.

Dancing, on a reversed dance floor, will be to a sound system of FM music tapes. The Billboard Lounge is aiming its music at adult singles.

SIMMONS ALSO is enthused about the Market Inn, which he said will feature designs on the walls of the deli fashioned after the

Eastern Market. The deli will include a bakery and complete take-out service. Interior designers are Design House, Inc., which did the Southfield Holiday Inn, Seven Mile.

Besides the Billboard Lounge seating 225 customers, the bowling center will have a quickie lounge for bowlers. Hamburgers, hot dogs and drinks will be served in the quickie lounge and on the bowling course.

All food service will be provided by the Market Inn, which also will have a counter for phone and carry-out orders. In the deli waitresses will be dressed colorfully in knickerbockers and wit with Market Inn hats. The West Bloomfield bowling center has been 2½ years in the making. The first concrete went into the ground July 8 of this year.

Occupying 45,000 square feet, the bowling center will be decorated in an orange and brown color scheme with carpet on the walls and floor. An all-day nursery will

take care of children whose parents are bowling.

The lanes will offer open bowling seven days a week, day and night. Leagues have been contracted, and there will be a large youth program Saturdays. The youth program will include a complete instruction program and a banquet. Simon said.
