

Late touchdown saves Country Day

Orchard Lake St. Mary won their fifth consecutive game Sunday, and they did it in a bit more shelling Hamtramck St. Flaminio, 51-54.

It didn't take St. Mary long to start the rout. The Eagles' Greg Williamson romped 40 yards on a reverse for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage. After Jim Pacorek ran for a two-point conversion, Jim Sobel recovered a St. Flaminio fumble on the next play.

St. Mary drove 27 yards on some plays with Rick Reul doing the scoring honors on a one-yard plunge. Pacorek passed to Williamson for the conversion.

On the ensuing kickoff, St. Flaminio had trouble with the squib kick, and Zenon Matyszek recovered for the Eagles. Pacorek passed to Tom Kovach for the TD and Philip Osmarski for two points.

BY THIS TIME, St. Mary had already scored three touchdowns, while St. Flaminio had been able to run just one play.

In the second quarter, Pacorek struck again, hitting Williamson on a 64-yard bomb for a TD, but, amazingly, they missed the extra point. The half ended, mercifully, with the Eagles on top, 30-0. St. Mary did not let up in the third quarter, as Pacorek ran 16 yards for one touchdown and Williamson went 30 for another.

Mark Mueller ran for the conversion after the first TD, and Reul kicked the extra point on the second.

The Eagles concluded their scoring in the fourth quarter on a three-yard run by

Pat Hybe to make it 51-0.

St. Flaminio rumbled the St. Mary shutout bid with a consolation touchdown late in the period. Ruben Gimes got into the end zone from one yard out, and Walt Jablonski added the two-point.

ST. MARY ROLLED UP 414 yards in total offense with Williamson accounting for 111 yards rushing on just six carries. Pacorek hit on all three of his pass attempts, two of them for touchdowns. He also ran for one score, one extra point play and passed twice for the points after touchdown.

The Eagles will now have to face the meat of their Catholic League Second Division schedule. They will play one-on-one St. Agatha on the road this Saturday, and then return home to meet Mt. Carmel the following weekend.
