The regiment is a mixture of band, color parties, dancers and life and drum players who dress in Civil War infantry, artillery and naval uniforms.

Farmington concert goers may remember the detail in each of their uniforms when the unit made its last visit to the area for a Summer in the Park program in 1973.

The 5th Michigan Regiment, commonly known to its members as "the 5th," was formed in Howell three years ago. The name comes from the 5th Michigan Volunteer Infantry Regiment from Livingston County which served with the Army of the Potomac from 1861-1865.

Bond holds open house

Bond School will hold open house 8:30 p.m. on Nov. 4 to introduce all interested persons in its adult education programs. The school is located at 31300 Thirteen Mile Road west of Orchard Lake.

Bond School is used for adult day time classes. High school completion classes are offered at no charge for those wishing to complete requirements to earn a high school diploma.

Teachers will be on hand for open house. New students will be welcomed to start classes at the beginning of the second semester, which starts Jan. 31.

The school also offers a variety of enrichment classes, such as bridge, needlepoint, ceramics and gourmet cooking. Enrichment teachers will also be on hand to answer questions as well as display crafts which are made in their classes.

English classes for foreign born have been extended to include an evening session on Wednesdays. There are also afternoon sessions held each week. The program will expand to accommodate new students.

There is no charge for high school completion classes or the English for the foreign born.

Farmington Public Schools is one of the few suburban school districts which offer any of these classes for adults during the day.

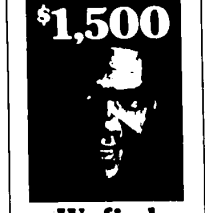
