Enrichment classes set for Friday

The fall edition of Adventures in Enrichment for children ages 1-6 features courses in art, cooking, juggling, story hour, music and science at the Southfield Child Development Center.

Registration fee for each eight-week session is \$14 for each course. Children enrolling in more than one class qualify for a reduced registration fee.

THE CENTER is located at 27700 Southfield Road, Lathrup Village, in the building which formerly housed Lathrup Elementary School.

Parent-child classes are available in the gym. The gym classes will offer exploratory, noncompetitive exercises aimed at developing coordination, perception, social and conceptual skills.

Science classes will focus on observational, sensory, action-oriented experiments with plants, cooking, animals and photography.

The art program will stress exploration

and experimentation with a variety of materials and techniques including puppetry, toy-dye, mural making, printing and collage art. Parents may attend the class with their children.

STORY HOUR WILL include some of the newest children's stories and will be accompanied with puppetry, songs and finger plays.

Cooking will feature experiences in tastes, textures and transformations as children create dips, drinks, hors d'oeuvres, sandwiches, salads and desserts. Nutritional and scientific aspects will be highlighted, school officials say.

Music class will encompass art and movement and will encourage children to create their own instruments and improvise their own choreography to songs, games and chants presented.

Classes are offered once a week on Tuesday mornings and Friday mornings and afternoons. Parents may contact the Child Development Center for specific class schedules, registration forms and additional information.

High schooler mute; charged with assault

A 17-year-old former Southfield High student was arraigned Wednesday, Oct. 29, in charges of attacking a woman in the school parking lot Sept. 8.

Larisa Bartley, who school officials say recently quit school, stood mute during her arraignment in Southfield District Court and a plea of innocent was entered for her by Judge Norman Feder. Miss Bartley was released on personal bond pending court trial in Southfield Dec. 17.

The former high school senior has been charged with assault and battery, a misdemeanor carrying a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail and \$500 fine.

The charge comes in connection with the alleged beating of Elaine Cooper, 39, of Southfield.

Mrs. Cooper said she was parking her car at the school when accosted by a group of six to eight girls. The girls began striking her car and then pulled her to the ground and kicked her repeatedly, Mrs. Cooper said.

A Southfield resident for nine years with three children in the school system, Mrs. Cooper asked school officials to investigate her charges. School officials have declined to become involved in the incident, saying the matter now rests with the courts.
