Eric, Rosemary win leader scholarships

Eric Caesar and Rosemary Abowd have won the Century III Leaders' scholarship competition. Caesar is a student at Farmington High School and Miss Abowd at the Lady of Mercy High School.

The local contest is part of the nation-wide competition for \$10,000 in scholarships at the state and national level. The program is administered by the National

Association of Secondary School Principals and funded by Shell Oil Company.

Runners-up in the competition at Farmington High were Steven Cordus and John McCallum. The runners-up at Our Lady of Mercy were Katherine Jo Stefanel and Juli Ann Wilson.

Graduating seniors' entries were judged on the basis of their leadership potential, with emphasis on community and extra-curricular activities, high scores on a current events exam, and on their writing viewpoints about America's needs and challenges for the future.

THE TWO now compete with other high school seniors from around the state for two \$1,000 scholarships and the opportunity for the \$10,000 national scholarship.

Michigan winners will receive an all-expense-paid trip to the second annual national Century III Leaders meeting in William Shure, Va. in March 1977 to participate in seminars on current issues.
