

Acting troupe does 'Brecht on Brecht'

"Brecht on Brecht," the Studio Company's second production of the 1976-77 season, opens Nov. 19.

The production includes selections from Brecht's most well-known plays: "The Three Penny Opera," "Mother Courage and Her Children," "The Caucasian Chalk Circle," and "Galileo," as well as selections from his poetry and essays.

"Brecht on Brecht" will play Nov. 19-21 and Dec. 2-5 in the Studio Theatre of Warner Hall. Curtain is 8:15 p.m. Thursday-Saturday, 6:30 p.m. on the first Sunday, and 5 and 6:30 p.m. the second Sunday. For reservations call 377-3015.

Directors Jerry Dahmann and Michael Shann are staff members of the Academy of Dramatic Art. Dahmann is director of the ADA and he has been a

professional actor and director for many years. He directed the 1972 ADA production "Spoon River Anthology" and last year appeared in Meadow Brook Theatre's productions of "Little Foxes" and "Born Yesterday."

Shann, production stage manager of the academy, has directed for regional theater, dinner theater and children's theater. In addition to directing most of the well-known favorites of children, he

has directed such productions as "The Miracle Worker," "A Midsummer Night's Dream," "Oklahoma!" "Paint Your Wagon" and "The Day After Tomorrow." Shann has been active in organizing a children's theater to be based in the Rochester area. The new group, known as Michigan Youth Theatre, will be using the talents of ADA staff members and graduates during the 1977 summer season.

Southfield doctor gets bond honors

Dr. Lloyd J. Paul, a Southfield resident, will be awarded the State of Israel's Eliezer Honored Humanities Award at the Medical Professors Division of State of Israel Bonds at their Nov. 20 dinner at Congregation Beth Achim in Southfield.

Medical Professors Division Chairman Dr. Joel I. Hamburger of Oak Park said the award is being made in recognition of the service to communal and Zionist causes that Dr. Paul has rendered for many years.

Chief of staff at Sinai Hospital, Dr. Paul said receiving this tribute from Israel is very meaningful and exciting. "I hope that this year under the capable hands of Dr. Hamburger, there will be a greater amalgamation between the medical professions with a common goal of concrete support for Israel's economic development during a time of dire need," Dr. Paul said.

The Medical Professors Division encompasses the health disciplines of medical doctor, osteopathy, optometry and podiatric medicine. Its members support Israel's economic development through the purchase of bonds.

In 1973, under Dr. Paul's leadership, the physicians in this division purchased nearly \$1 million of Israel Bonds.

A native Detroit, Dr. Paul is a graduate of Wayne State University and the Chicago Medical School.

During the Korean War, he served as a medical officer in the U.S. 2nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, N.C.

An internist, he is an adjunct assistant professor of internal medicine at Wayne State medical school, is on the staff of Grace Hospital and is a trustee of the Michigan Society of Internal Medicine.

He is a past chairman of the Medical Professors Division of the Allied Jewish Campaign, a founder-member of Israel Bonds, Prime Minister's Club, a member of Branksy Lodge of Bnai B'rith and the Boy F. Green Post of the Jewish War Veterans, and other communal organizations including Congregation B'nai Moshe. Dr. Paul and his wife, Doris, have four children: Steven, Sander, Daniel and Dennis.

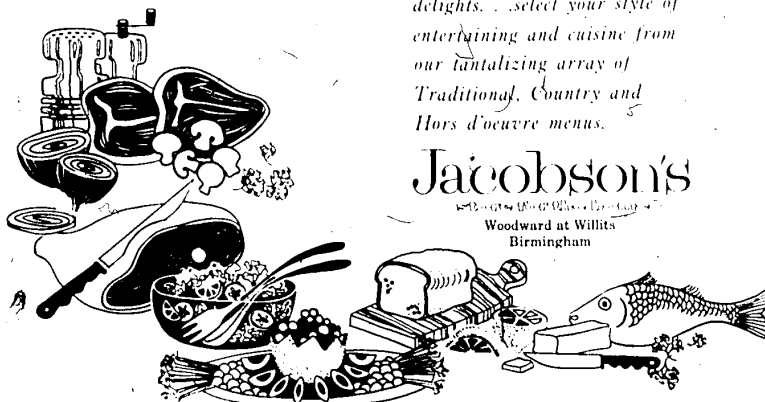


