

Harrison gridders earn place in playoffs

Farmington Harrison's season-long dream for an undefeated record and a state playoff berth came true Saturday afternoon with a 28-14 victory over the Plymouth Salem Rocks.

pull the victory out, as Salem mistakes led to three of the Harrison touchdowns.

The statistics showed a totally different ball game, as the Rocks dominated most of the action with 320 yards rushing, to only 127 for Harrison.

The difference was Harrison's ability to capitalize on two Salem fumbles and a blocked punt for three touchdowns.

HARRISON'S TOM REYNOLDS started the game with a bang, returning Salem's opening kickoff 89 yards down the left side line for a touchdown. Brent Harrison converted his first of four extra point kicks and Harrison had a 70 lead after 13 seconds of action.

Hewlett bulled over from two yards out for the first touchdown, and halfback Steve Mazoner danced in from the 11 for the second. Bob Wade kicked both conversions, and the Rocks held a 14-7 margin after eight minutes of play.

BUT FROM THAT point it was all Harrison as the defense lightened and the offense controlled the ball, thanks to their potential all-state tailback, Mike Bowen.

The Hawks scored 14 points of their own in the second quarter. Harrison's Jerry Prescott recovered a Rock fumble at the Salem 42, and five plays later, the score was tied 14-14 when Bowen crashed over from the two.

Harrison blocked a Salem punt with 1:30 left in the first half, and quarterback Bill Thorne quickly engineered a six play, 47 yard drive in less than a minute to give Bowen the lead for good.

A clutch catch by Bert Barsch for 23 yards sent the Hawks to Salem's 33 yard line, where Bowen scored the final touchdown two plays later.

Bowen controlled the ball better on the second half and kept it away from them.

Coach Pat Duthie's North Farmington squad ripped Westland John Glenn 10-2 last Thursday evening in an NSL contest in the pool. The Hawks won the 100 yarders with a 9:3 overall record and 6-0 in conference meets.

The 400 freestyle relay—Patsie Smith, Eggers, Theresa Sisk and Jackie Sisk—established another pool record with a 3:37.2 effort.

Farmington's 200 medley relay—Gandy Noel, Pam Henke, Tina Richardson and Gandy Henke—turned in its best swim of the season with a 2:04.8 time, a first place finish.

Farmington will host the ILL girls swimming meet on Thursday at 7 pm. Meres-Beggs Farmington's Our Lady of Mercy took first in all 11 events and defeated Harper Woods 10-2 in a Central League girls swimming meet on Nov. 19 in Meres' pool.

Meris' Mary Sue Patek won the 200 freestyle in 6:01.
