If you are purchasing costly gifts, Consumer Reports can be a guide to what brands to buy. You may discover you don't have to spend \$200 on a camera when an off-brand camera for \$125 may offer the same features.

Many people overlook store brands in favor of purchasing national brand merchandise. Store brands are often of equal quality but lower priced. They are worth considering for holiday purchases

Comparison shopping can be conducted by reading newspaper advertisements and by using the Yellow Pages.

By calling stores that carry merchandise you want to buy, you can discover prices, who will repair the gift if defective, and return policies

Many stores will not take back a

gift without a receipt. Some will exchange it for cash, others for due bills. Which stores do which may influence where you want to buy gifts.

Lastly, shop early to avoid lastminute buying panics. By shopping now, you can take advantage of sales, promotions and wellstocked stores.

If you are planning on charging your gift purchases, try to buy early in your billing month. This gives you extra time to get money to pay the account in full, avoiding interest charges.

For instance, if your closing date is the 15th of the month and you make your purchases on the 16th, you will have til the 15th of the next month plus another 25 days after that before you have to pay your bill.

Buy yourself a gift by putting the money for the gifts in a savings account to draw interest until you have to pay the charge account. Use the interest you earned to buy yourself a holiday treat.
