Tenants' rights bill signed

A bill which prohibits landlords from using certain techniques to evict tenants was signed into law recently by Gov. William G. Milliken.

The new law permits any tenant who is unlawfully ejected to recover triple damages or \$300, whichever is greater, plus costs and reasonable attorney fees.

The law also permits a tenant who has unlawfully been interfered with by the owner or management to recover the amount of his loss or \$300, whichever is greater, and where possession has been lost, to regain possession.

Unlawful interference includes:
 • The use of force or threat of force
 • The removal, retention or destruction of personal property of the tenant
 • A change, alteration or addition to the locks on the property without providing keys or unlocking devices to the tenant

2 law seminars focus on feds

The Detroit Chapter of the Federal Bar Association (FBA) is sponsoring two seminars geared toward introducing attorneys to the practice of law in federal courts and with federal agencies.

At the first seminar Tuesday, judges, court administrators, U.S. attorneys and private practitioners experienced in federal trial practice will present half-day programs on civil and criminal practice and procedure in federal courts.

The Tuesday seminar and luncheon is from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Wayne State University's McGregor Center. Cost is \$15 for the seminar, course material, lunch and reception.

The second seminar on Dec. 2 will focus on government contracts management. A variety of subjects will be presented to attorneys whose clients do business with the federal government.
