Moral perspectives Proposal A approval is only the beginning

The passage of Proposal A banning non-returnable bottles may have been a giant victory against such organized opposition, but it certainly is but a small step in our efforts to clean up the earth.

One can only hope that those who voted for Proposal A will become the nucleus for the body of people we need to care for the earth in a more responsible manner.

It will not be easy to clean up our environment, and passing anti-litter laws is not likely to do much until the populace assumes a greater responsibility for our habitat. And everyone who has ever taken a walk through a park, a ride through the country or a stroll downtown knows that not many people have taken this responsibility seriously.

PROPOSAL A certainly will make it more costly to litter, and it will offer a way for others to pick up "throw-away" money, but nothing will really be changed about the way we take care of our planet until we decide to do it.

We have laws prohibiting everything from suicide to spitting, but abiding by the laws has never been a matter of enforcement but a matter of the will.

This is not to say that Proposal A is useless. It is not. As has been said many times, we cannot legislate morality, but we can say what we no longer accept.

And further, we have the powerful influence of profit driving our self-interest and beer industries to create other techniques and enticements for the purchase of their products.

WE HAVE BEEN sufficiently warned about the accelerating accumulation of debris and garbage that befouls our rivers, clutters the land and pollutes the atmosphere, and I believe that we are all aware of the responsibility we have to care for this earth.

What we need to do now is start meeting that responsibility wherever we are. Proposal A will not do it for us. We will have to work at it ourselves.
