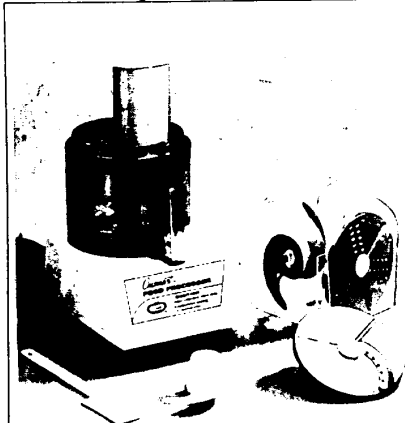

Wallcovering gives Dramatic face lift

Of all the categories of home furnishings, wallcovering can be the least expensive and most dramatic way of giving your home a face lift, if it needs one. Decorating your walls will provide excitement and the visual effect will enhance other furnishings that may have begun to look tired and forlorn. With more than 1,500 sample books of wallpaper on the market, each containing at least 100 patterns, you can actually have fun selecting backgrounds for your home if you keep an open mind and let yourself go. There need not be modesty or regimentation attached to choosing colors and co-ordinating patterns, for today you can make your own rules, express yourself vividly and feel comfortable with your selection. You can mix periods and patterns in a conservative fashion or with flamboyance. But whatever your style there will be a wallcovering to suit your particular taste. Be take along samples of fabrics and carpeting from your home so as to precisely co-ordinate colors. Also, consider the size and exposure of your room, for certain colors will profit better in a small or dim room. Foil and mylar backgrounds will enlarge and enhance a small room with little window exposure, particularly when used on the ceiling as well as walls. The multitude of wallcoverings include those with aesthetic qualities like ones that look and feel like suede while being washable vinyl; cork look-alikes, and grasscloth variations ranging from slightly textured to heavily woven materials. There are wet look and matt finish papers, and wallcoverings which can be mistaken for wood paneling, for they have texture of real bark. There is also now available an adhesive that allows you to cover your cupboards, wood paneled rooms, or cement block walls regardless of the surface. It will allow you to use paper where you never could before, and thereby achieve an entirely new look. You can add dimension to a room and gain a focal point with a scenic paper or graphic. A dado will change the appearance of a room when paper is used above or below it, and for an unusual effect, try using a wide stripe in a horizontal fashion running across a room. Do not be reluctant to use the same paper in two adjoining rooms for it will give an illusion of spaciousness and solve many a problem of co-ordinating patterns. If you feel uncertain about your choice of color or if the proportions of a pattern frighten you, do order a sample roll to be tested at home amidst your own surroundings. Very often a thorough wallcovering studio will have a design consultant who will come to your home upon request and aid you in making selections. This service can be most reassuring to the inexperienced shopper.
