Village offers take-out program on Christmas

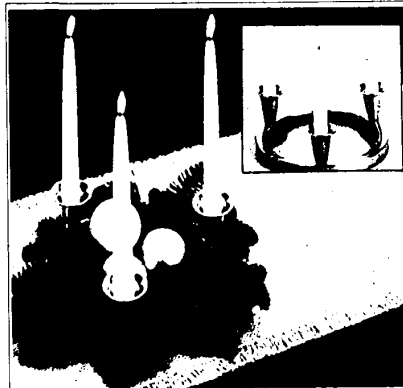
Greenfield Village and Henry Ford Museum Speakers Bureau, a function of the office of public relations, has announced a new program available during December to area senior, civic and community organizations.
