## Police Explain 'Tardy' Reply

FARMINGTON  
Farmington Township police deny allegations of indifference and improper handling in a recent incident involving a youngster throwing a rock through a windshield.

ON JULY 21, Mrs. Robert D. Button of 22122 Ontario Court was driving on her street with five children in her car when a rock hurled through her windshield spreading glass throughout the car.

After turning the auto around, she used the phone at a nearby house to call police. According to the township police report, the call came in at 2:30 p.m. Mrs. Button said she was told it might take 15 minutes before a policeman would be on the scene because of the afternoon shift change. However, it took over an hour, she claimed.

THE POLICE report was logged at 3:30 p.m. Corporal Norman Stainbrook explained that when an officer arrives at the scene, he investigates the complaint and then fills out the report.

Patrolman Roger Vollmer, who came on duty at three and was assigned to the incident, told the Enterprise and Observer he had been on the scene some 10 minutes before filling out the report.

That would place his arrival at approximately 3:20 p.m., 50 minutes after Mrs. Button's call. Lieutenant William Kelly said a shift change could add 10 minutes of waiting to the normal 15 minutes it would take a policeman to arrive to investigate a property damage complaint.

The complaint against the police handling of the incident was brought out when a neighbor of the Buttons, Mrs. Richard Mazurek of 22047 Ontario, wrote a letter to The Enterprise and Observer.

In her letter, Mrs. Mazurek also claimed Patrolman Vollmer was indifferent in handling the incident. She cited that he did not even get out of the patrol car.

KELLY confirmed that Vollmer did not get out of the car, "in most cases it's best for an officer to remove himself from the vehicle and check the area but each case must be weighed," Kelly explained.

Kelly added that while Mrs. Button was not pleased by the Western Michigan University junior Jack Magnuson of Flint (Albion) has won two straight Mid-American Conference 800-yard run titles, adding to his string with a 1:51.8 triumph in Kalamazoo this year.
