A: Ed Sullivan. TV censors, however, only allowed Elvis to be shown from the waist up. Sullivan also brought the Beatles to American television.

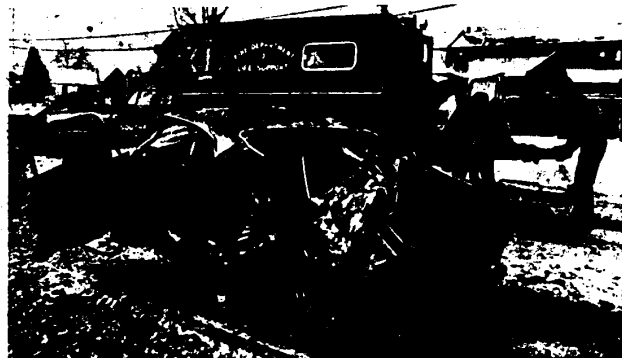
Q: Richard Boone was a cultured gun for hire in this TV classic.

## Woman killed on N'western

Elaine Ferrer, 30, of 4223 Twelve Mile, Farmington Hills, was struck and killed by a car on Northwestern High in Southfield about 2:40 a.m. Wednesday.

Southfield police said Mrs. Ferrer was walking on the highway south of Twelve Mile when she was struck by a northbound car driven by Robert A. Turner, 31, of Pontiac. Turner, an off-duty Southfield police officer on his way home, hit Mrs. Ferrer as she walked across the middle lane of the highway, police said.

Turner stopped after hitting the woman, to see what happened and attempted to provide emergency first aid. Police and paramedics from Southfield Fire Department's Life Support Unit were called to the scene. The woman was taken to Providence Hospital where she was dead on arrival.

Witnesses told police they had seen Mrs. Ferrer walking in and out of traffic on the highway prior to the accident.

The accident remains under investigation by Southfield police. It makes the 16th traffic fatality in the city this year.

## Thief leaves a calling card

Southfield police should have little trouble locating a man who held up a shopper at Northland Shopping Center last week.

The man reportedly approached another man in the shopping center parking lot and asked for change for a \$20 bill. Police said the man produced his wallet and the thief was holding both while the second man withdrew his wallet and began to make change.

At this point, police said, the first man pulled a weapon and demanded all of the second man's money.

Police, who now have the rubber's license, say they are confident the man will soon be apprehended.
