•The Hills fire department beefed up its squad by budgeting five full-time firefighters beginning July 1.

•The closed Farmington Junior High School was being eyed as a training center for special education by the Oakland Training Institute.

•Farmington Hills residents learned they would be faced with a two-mill tax increase because of decreased revenues combined with continuing inflation.

•A voter participation committee was established to study the hows and whys of getting Farmington and Farmington Hills voters to go to the polls.
