Glenn nips N. Farmington, 52-50

The first half of play was a back-and-forth struggle with both teams having trouble hitting on any kind of shooting.

John Glenn used a zone defense while North Farmington countered with a man-to-man. But nothing seemed to help either team out of their slump.

At the half the score was, 27-26, Glenn.

Moving into the second half, the pace changed very little as both teams still couldn't hit from the floor.

Finally, the Rockets pulled ahead by five points late in the final quarter. But North Farmington wouldn't say die and came back fighting.

The Raiders took control of the ball, with the clock ticking away its last minutes.

After hitting on a bucket, the Raiders got hold of the ball again when John Glenn turned it over. The bucket was good and North Farmington was down by one point with one chance left.

With four seconds left in the game, the Raiders got the ball again and tried a desperation shot but it didn't hit the hoop and John Glenn took the win.

"Neither team played to their ability. We didn't permit as a team the way we should have," said Glenn coach Gordon Davis.

Leading the Glenn attack were Dar Daidion with 20 points and Darar Armstrong with 10.

For North Farmington, Mark Bentley had 15 points and Mike Garcia and Mark Thompson each had 10.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at the Special Election to be held in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, on Monday, January 17, 1977, the following propositions will be submitted to vote of the qualified electors of said School District:

PROPOSITION FOR RENEWAL AND CONTINUATION OF OPERATING MILLAGE INCREASE
As a renewal and continuation of a certain operating millage increase heretofore approved by the electorate, which increase expired with the 1976 levy, shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied against all taxable real and tangible personal property in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, be increased as provided by Section 5, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan by \$5.00 per one thousand dollars of the assessed valuation, as finally equalized, of all such property in said School District for a period of ten (10) years, from 1977 to 1986, both inclusive, to be used only for the purpose of paying general operating expenses of said School District?

PROPOSITION FOR OPERATING MILLAGE INCREASE
Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied against all taxable real and tangible personal property in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, be increased as provided by Section 6, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan by \$3.00 per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation, as finally equalized, of all such property in said School District for a period of five (5) years, from 1977 to 1981, both inclusive, to be used only for the purpose of paying general operating expenses of said School District?

Each person voting on the foregoing propositions must be a citizen of the United States, above the age of eighteen (18) years and a registered voter of the School District.

The polls of election will be open from 7:00 A.M. in the morning until 8:00 P.M. in the evening, local time.
