"It's a tremendous credit" to the voters who supported the two millage requests. Hunt said. He also thanked the members of the board and administration who took part in the informational campaign leading up to the election.

CLARENCEVILLE VOTERS have traditionally supported millage and bond issue proposals.

The last millage defeat was nearly nine years ago and that proposal was approved in a special election held six weeks later.

The only other proposals defeated were in 1962, although they were also eventually approved by voters. In Monday's vote on the millage in-

crease, Precinct 2, which covers the part of Livonia between Seven and Eight Mile and Inkster Road and Ang-ling carried the election.

That precinct approved the in-crease, 87-34—or more than double the margin of victory in the entire dis-

Precinct 3 in Livonia approved the millage boost by a 61-48 margin. That precinct takes in the section of the dis-trict south of Seven Mile.

On a percentage basis, the tax re-newal was approved 72-28 while the in-crease squeezed by a 51.8-48.2 margin.

The money, the board and administration said during the campaign, is needed merely to maintain existing programs and services for the school year starting next fall. The increase won't be reflected in local won't be reflected in local tax bills until next winter.
