Vacant building won't stay vacant

The owner of the vacant building at 27060 Evergreen, near Eleven Mile, told Lathrup Village City Council Monday night that he would "love to have the property secured if anyone can show me how to do it."

At the discussion on what should be done with the vacant building, owner Carl Driscoll talked about the problems of keeping the building boarded up so it isn't harmful to trespassers.

"But anything I put up, they tear down," said Driscoll, defining "they" as "maybe youths in the area."

According to City Atty. James McCrory, the building has been boarded up for approximately one year. It was inspected Nov. 30, 1976 and Jan. 20, 1977 by police officers. Both times it was "standing open to trespassers," McCrory said.

The council unanimously voted to direct the city administrator Gerald Stone to arrange the building to make it safe and secure and no longer open to trespassers, according to McCrory.

"It will be left to the discretion of the Public Service Administration as to how to do it," he explained.

Councilman Vincent Zetall asked Driscoll, a Lathrup Village resident and real estate developer, if it were feasible for the building to be put to use.

Driscoll replied, "I don't think so because it is damaged as far as I fix it up." He mentioned the building may soon be sold for renovation into a restaurant if the city grants the request filed by the potential owners.

McCrory suggested since it isn't feasible to upgrade or demolish the building due to the pending sale, the city have it barricaded "one more time. The city has to do something about it since it is liable if anyone is injured on that property," he added.
