## Emergency Medical Services information shared by LWV

After a year of study on Emergency Medical Services in Farmington and West Bloomfield, the local branch of League of Women Voters offer to share the information with the residents.

"We are eager to share what we have learned because the league feels most citizens have little knowledge of exactly what Emergency Medical Services are available, or not available," said Jo Roberts, speaking for the group.

"In the event of severe medical emergencies such as cardiac arrest, severe burns, or someone in shock, who would you call?" she asked. "Who would come? What would they do?"

The questions will be answered in a program the league has prepared that will be given on request to any group in Farmington, Farmington Hills and West Bloomfield.

To schedule a program, persons in Farmington and Farmington Hills are asked to call Mary Lazaraton, 851-6027. In West Bloomfield, call Charlotte Deffen, 868-6393.

A complete packet of information on the subject has been prepared to be distributed to all guests.

The program will describe Emergency Medical Services, in general; how emergency care is delivered in the three communities; and statistics relating to coronary deaths and accidental highway deaths in Oakland County.

The league's study was made from interviews with city officials, fire chiefs, hospital emergency room physicians and ambulance service operators.

The JNF is the land development and reforestation agency of Israel.

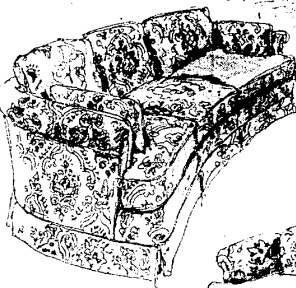
## Center helps county

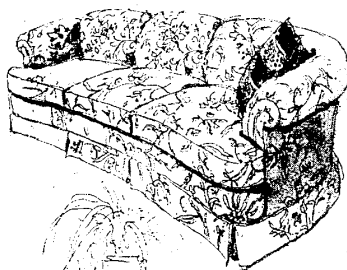

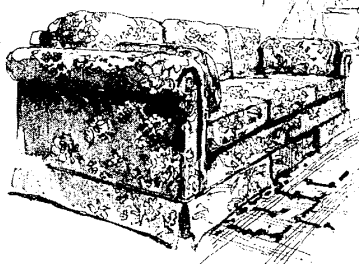

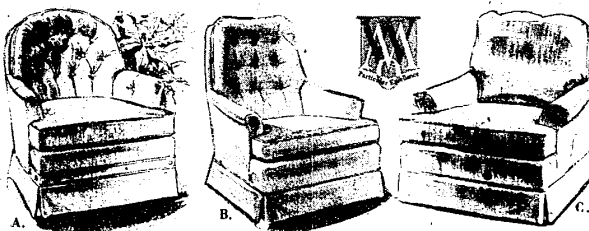
