## Planners have restaurant reservations

A request to build a restaurant in the Mount Vernon-Southfield Road area will be sent to Southfield City Council with a unanimous recommendation for denial by planning commissioners.

Southfield Planning Commission Jan. 26 voted 7-0 in opposition to a special use bid by Sambo's of Michigan for a Jolly Tiger restaurant in a small office district.

The proposed site is on the east side of Southfield Road between Mount Vernon and Louise.

The petition met with strong homeowner protest. Among objections were

that the planned restaurant would lower property values in the area, compound traffic problems on two-lane Mount Vernon and would generate cooking odors, lights and noise.

Planning commissioners said the request fails to comply with an ordinance which adds special uses, including restaurants, in two-story office districts. The measure was designed to stimulate occupancy in the city's glutted small office market.

In other action last Wednesday, commissioners supported the request of GM Building Co. to rezone 1.23 acre of residential land to allow a 44-unit low-rise apartment development. The property is on the west side of Lahser between Halcroft and Twelve Mile. Voting against the petition was William Fenkel.

ANOTHER ITEM on the agenda was a request by Richard and Pearl Goldsmith to rezone 2.99 acres on the north side of Twelve Mile between Briarbank and Brooks Lane from a single-family residential to a townhouse category. Commissioners unanimously recommended approval for the rezoning which would allow 20 dwelling units on the site.

## Shakespeare slated

"Kings and Cabbages," an evening of Shakespearean scenes by the Oakland University Academy of Dramatic Art, will open the season of A Taste of Art and Culture, at 8 p.m. Sunday in the Oak Park Community Center.

Season tickets at \$10 are available from the Oak Park Public Library for a season of six programs which sample Oak Park's performing arts. The series is sponsored by the City of Oak Park Arts and Cultural Commission. Additional tickets, if available, will sell for \$3 at the door. For information, call 548-7230.

The package also features the Oak Park Symphony with the Michigan Opera Theatre in a pro-

gram of music from opera on Feb. 27 and the Oak Park Community Theatre presenting Tennessee Williams' "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof," on March 3 and 10.

Other programs will feature the Jewish Community Center Festival Dances, the annual spring concert of the Oak Park Civic Chorus and a film and afterglow.

"Kings and Cabbages," this year's touring production of the Academy of Dramatic Art, founded as a training adjunct to the Meadow Brook Theatre by John Fernald, features scenes from "Hamlet," "Macbeth," "Anthony and Cleopatra" and "Othello."
