Budget shifts OK'd

A number of changes in the 1976-77 Southfield Board of Education budget were approved last week by school board members. Most changes were caused by adjustments in salaries, but were offset by other changes in the \$25.4 million budg-

Reasons for the salary changes, school officials said, were due to replacement of individuals, settlement of contracts after adoption of the original budget, and delays in filling certain positions. The budget includes a \$10,000 increase in special education salaries, a \$57,000 increase in admisstative salaries, and a \$1,000 increase in admisstative salaries, and as \$1,000 increase in the business office operations, also due largely to salary changes. All increases were balanced by decreases in other areas of the budget. Part of the increase came when teachers changed from Blue Cross Insurance to the higher cost of MESSA insurance, school officials said. This created an additional expense of \$39,000.


